#### PLANT A TREE AWARD



#### **PENNY PINES**

Since launching a partnership in 2004 with the United States Forest Service, an agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, National Garden Clubs Inc., and it's members in Garden Clubs across the nation, have played an active role in restoring our forests by donating tens of thousands Pennies. What began in California in 1941 as a statewide conservation program, Penny Pines has now expanded to all 50 states. The program replaces National and Urban forested areas damaged by insects, fires or natural catastrophes. For every \$68 donated, the forest plants 200 seedlings, which means that our garden clubs have contributed to help supply hundreds of thousands trees!

## WREATHS ACROSS AMERICA

This December 14th, on National Wreaths Across America Day, our mission to REMEMBER the fallen, HONOR those that serve, and TEACH the next generation the value of freedom, is carried out by coordinating wreath-laying ceremonies at Arlington National Cemetery, as well as at more than 4600+ participating locations in all 50 U.S. states, at sea, and abroad. Join us by sponsoring a veteran's wreath at a cemetery near you, or by volunteering or donating to a local sponsorship group. The cost is \$17 each wreath. ### EGC T-shirt / sweatshirt REORDER


#### Don't miss out! Last opportunity to order at the November meeting.
