

Bylaws of the ...

"Global Consortium of Professionals & Researchers" (GCPR)

Article I: Name and Purpose

Section 1: Name

The name of the organization shall be the "Global Consortium of Professionals & Researchers" (GCPR) as mentioned above

Section 2: Purpose

It is dedicated to:

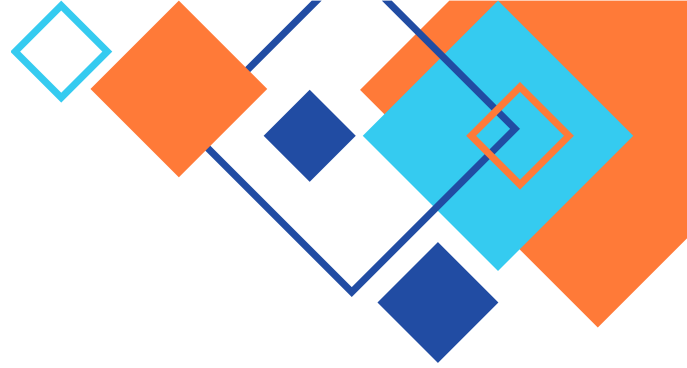
1. Promoting research in respective disciplines.
2. Publishing high-quality academic and industry-related articles.
3. Organizing conferences, workshops, and seminars for knowledge sharing.
4. Facilitating networking among researchers, practitioners, and industry leaders.
5. Encouraging innovation and collaboration in the respective fields.

Article II: Membership

Section 1: Eligibility

Fellow Member Eligibility

To be eligible as a member, candidates should be enrolled or employed at a recognized academic, research, or professional institution with a demonstrated interest in actively contributing to the organization's activities, publications, and events; for the elevated designation of Senior Member, individuals must possess at least 5-10 years of professional experience in academia, research, or industry, supported by evidence such as published work, leadership roles, patents, or industry recognition, along with strong endorsements from peers or existing Senior Members.



Fellow Member Eligibility

Fellowship represents the highest and most distinguished level of recognition. It is reserved for a small percentage of professionals who have demonstrated sustained international or national impact, original contributions, and peer-acknowledged leadership. Fellowship is not honorary or automatic; it is earned through rigorous peer-reviewed evaluation and conferred only upon those whose distinction is globally evident.

Candidates must demonstrate excellence in two or more of the following distinguished areas:

1. Scholarly Excellence

- A substantial body of influential, peer-reviewed publications, books, or patents.
- Widely recognized for advancing frontier knowledge in STEM disciplines.

2. Innovation & Original Contributions

- Pioneering technologies, methods, or frameworks that transformed academic, industrial, or societal practices.
- Demonstrated adoption or measurable global impact of such innovations.

3. Leadership & Influence

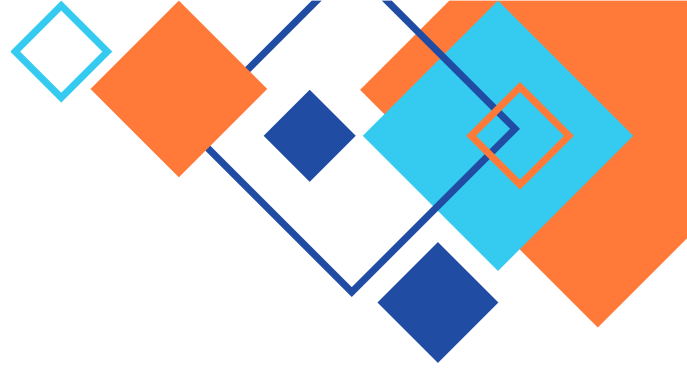
- Senior executive, academic, or research leadership positions shaping institutions or industries.
- Influence on policy, professional standards, or innovation ecosystems at national or international levels.

4. Recognition by Peers

- Recipient of prestigious awards, honors, or highly selective professional distinctions.
- Membership in highly selective professional associations, where admission is based on demonstrated excellence, distinguished contributions, and peer-recognized achievements, affirming that Fellows are regarded among the most accomplished professionals in their discipline.

5. Global Standing

- Sustained national or international recognition as a thought leader and innovator.
- Clear evidence of being among the small percentage at the very top of the field



Section 2: Categories of Membership

1. Premium Fellow Members: Researchers, professionals, and academics.
2. Institutional Members: Universities, research centers, and corporate entities.
3. Honorary Members: Individuals recognized for their significant contributions to the field.

Section 3: Membership Rights

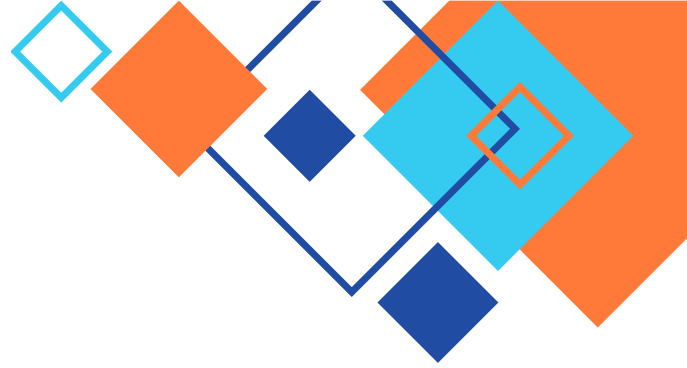
Members in good standing are entitled to:

- Participate in conferences and events.
- Access publications.
- Vote in general meetings (except Student Members).
 - Nominate candidates for positions in the Executive Council. Article III: Governance

Section 1: Governing Structure

The association shall be governed by the Executive Council, comprising the following positions:

1. President
2. Vice President (VP)
3. General Secretary
4. Members of the Executive Council (up to 10)



Section 2: Duties of Officers

1. President:

- Acts as the chief executive officer.
- Represents the association at official events.
- Oversees strategic initiatives and presides over meetings.

2. Vice President:

- Supports the President in executing duties.
- Assumes the President's responsibilities in their absence.

3. General Secretary:

- Manages correspondence and records.
- Prepares meeting agendas and minutes.
- Ensures compliance with the bylaws.

4. Executive Council Members:

- Advise on strategy and governance.
- Lead committees on research, conferences, and publications.

Section 3: Terms of Office

1. All officers shall serve a term of two years.
2. Officers may seek re-election for one additional term, subject to a majority vote.

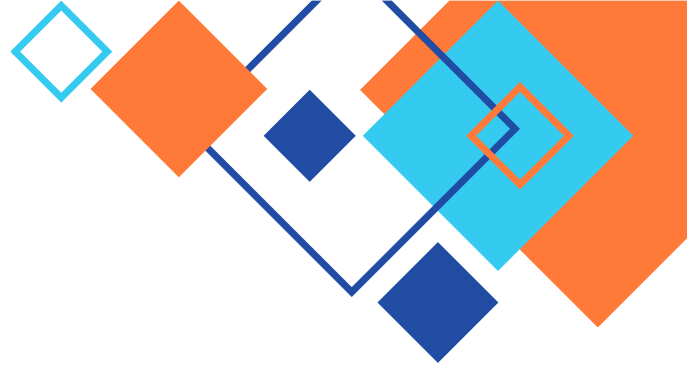
Article IV: Committees

Section 1: Standing Committees

The association shall establish the following committees:

1. Research and Publication Committee:

- Oversees the publication of journals and proceedings.



- Reviews and approves research submissions.

2. Conference and Events Committee:

- Plans and executes conferences, workshops, and seminars.

3. Membership and Networking Committee:

- Manages member recruitment and engagement.
- Facilitates collaborations and partnerships.

Section 2: Ad-Hoc Committees

The President, with the approval of the Executive Council, may establish temporary committees for specific tasks.

Article V: Meetings

Section 1: General Meetings

1. An annual general meeting (AGM) shall be held to review the association's activities and elect officers as needed.
2. Notice of the AGM shall be sent to members at least 30 days in advance.

Section 2: Executive Council Meetings

The Executive Council shall meet quarterly to discuss and decide on strategic and operational matters.

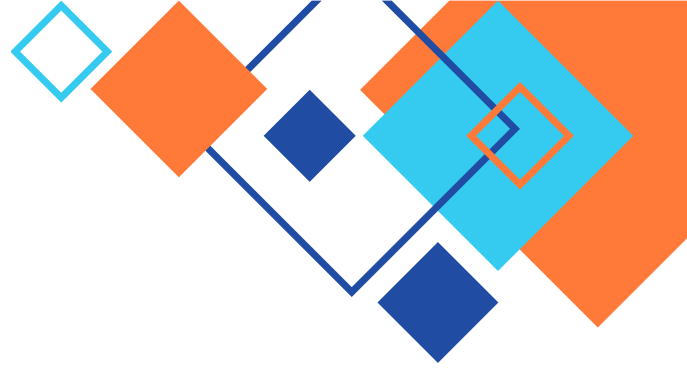
Section 3: Quorum

1. For the AGM, a quorum shall consist of 25% of voting members.
2. For Executive Council meetings, a quorum shall consist of 50% of Council members.

Article VI: Finances

Section 1: Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the association shall run from January 1 to December 31.



Section 2: Membership Dues

1. Membership dues shall be determined by the Executive Council.
2. Honorary members shall be exempt from dues.

Section 3: Financial Oversight

The Executive Council shall ensure that:

1. Funds are used solely for association activities.
2. An annual financial report is prepared and presented at the AGM.

Article VII: Amendments

Amendments to these bylaws may be proposed by:

1. The Executive Council.
2. A petition signed by at least 10% of the voting members.

Proposed amendments shall be ratified by a two-thirds majority of members present at the AGM.

Article VIII:

In the event of the association's dissolution, all remaining assets will be irrevocably dedicated to a charitable purpose. Following the settlement of all debts and obligations, these assets shall be transferred to one or more non-profit organizations that share similar objectives, as determined by the Executive Council. This ensures our mission endures and complies with all legal requirements for non-profit entities.
