Information about Enforcement of Underage Drinking Laws (EUDL):

Dirigo Safety is a contractor for the Maine Center for Disease Control providing administrative oversight of their grant funding for the Enforcement of Underage Drinking Laws (EUDL) program. This includes outreach and recruitment of law enforcement agencies to implement EUDL strategies, data analysis, training, facilitation of funding and general oversight of the program.

What is the EUDL goal?

The Enforcement Underage Drinking Law (EUDL) goal is to reduce underage drinking in communities around the state of Maine by systematically implementing best or promising practices that attain the objectives of increasing the enforcement of underage drinking laws and enhancing research-based prevention planning. The EUDL program helps the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and the 5 U.S territories preventing underage drinking by emphasizing law enforcement.

The EUDL program is designed to:

- Improve Maine's system for analyzing underage drinking data to guide strategic planning
- Systematically increasing the effective and visible enforcement of underage drinking laws through enhanced research-based prevention and intervention programming

Maine's EUDL Program focuses its efforts on three groups:

- Youth under age 21
- Adults who provide alcohol to minors or provide places for minors to consume; and
- Law enforcement, parents, merchants, and other adults in Maine communities who act to prevent youth alcohol use and related high-risk behaviors.

Law Enforcement Training:

Trainings for law enforcement are an important part of the EUDL grant. Officers and local coalition members receive up-to-date training on underage drinking prevention and enforcement strategies from other experienced law enforcement officers. The trainings also allow the officers to network with one another, especially if they are from neighboring towns.
