The President, Helen Bachrach, called the meeting to order at 3:30 pm.

Secretary Report – The minutes from the April board meeting had been emailed and were approved as submitted.

Treasurer Report – Noel Kuck submitted the financial report and it was approved by the board. We have received funds for the water bottle station.

Old Business

RHGNA received an Achievement Award of \$75.00 at the Neighborhood Conference. Thanks to Kaye Bultemeier for writing the proposal.

Sign Repair- The artist has been having difficulties with the equipment necessary to make repairs to our sign but said he should have it completed by the end of October.

Planter Boxes were gifted to the City Council at their meeting on April 23rd.

Sculptures on the Bridge- We have applied to the city for this project. They are in favor, and may give us a grant. We haven't gotten their final decision, depends on what the city will let us do. We probably won't get a final decision until December.

Water Bottle Refilling Station- We have received a grant from the Downtown Knoxville Alliance and have begun this project. We also received grants from Gwen McKenzie, City Council, and the Thrivent Group. We will not be responsible for water use once the system is operational. The city has installed a water meter. We anticipate, once the project is complete, that we will have funds left over. A motion was made, seconded, and approved that a letter be submitted to the CBID Downtown Knoxville Alliance requesting the balance of the money to be repurposed for some of our other projects. Mark Miller, Kaye Bultemeier and Ed Patrick will draft the letter.

Pia Serspinski has been filling our Free Little Library Box and other citizens have been filling it as well.

New Business

Annual website fee – this has been covered by donations in the past. John David and Donna Curry offered to cover it this year. Noel will look into how the payment can be processed through the RHGNA.

Noel emphasized that the RHGNA can receive operational funds when members sign into the Kroger and designate a percentage of purchases to our organization. We can also get donations through smile.amazon.com. John David will begin including that information in each of his emails to the members.

Neighborhood Garden- Our garden areas are growing. Helen suggested that we Adoptan-Area to provide an increased feeling of community and allow it to accommodate individual scnedules (snort term, Iall, spring, etc).
