2. REPORTS FROM OFFICERS

President's Report - David Gallant

TMR – Regional Dispatch - Codiac will be the next region for TMR and Regional Dispatching. Should be a smooth transition compared to Fredericton. Testing has been done.

R2MR Course – Funding from federal government available now for first responders. SEFFA hasn't done any training yet. At the last meeting it was agreed to start with Officers first. 8 hours course. VP's will contact each of their counties prior to next meeting.

Scene Security – This has been an issue for a long time. The OFM has found funding to be able to cover the cost of scene security by hiring commissionaires. This is effective April 1. The funding will be issued to the NBAFC and the invoicing will be handled through the NBAFC (Nadine). The Fire Dept will call the Fire Marshal's office. They will determine if they will come to check the scene. Scene security will be coordinated if needed.

Mobile Burn Unit – They have been trying to get funding. Some movement. The NBAFC feels this may happen for us.

Jim Hayter Memorial Scholarship – see e-mail attached.

Cancer Fundraiser Fundy Bay Fire Dept – see e-mail attached.

Cell Phone Coverage – this has been an issue for many areas. Even with cell phone boosters, it is not enough. People on the trails and at camps do not have service.

Government Relations Week – This takes place in Ottawa each year with the Ministers. If they supported the initiatives of the NBAFC there was still no guarantee funding would be available because the budgets had already been set. This year they changed the date and it now takes place <u>before</u> the budgets are finalized.

NBAFC Conference – May 2018 - The NBAFC is asking each Association to ask each fire department within their association if they would be willing to give \$100 to help with the cost of the ladies program for the annual convention in May. E-mail distributed to Chiefs.

Talking Points of MLA – Message sent from Dan McCoy of NBAFC. The NBAFC would like us to reach out to our MLA's regarding some topics. There is more info on the NBAFC website. E-mail to be

distributed to Chiefs. Dave suggested that if Chiefs are interested, they group together and meet with their MLA rather than individual meetings.

Gear Cleaning - Platoon Chief Bruens had invited Don Sage to conduct a demonstration of the gear cleaning – he will attend our April meeting.

Carbon Monoxide training took place December 7, 2017 – this was a really good information session that was put on by the Fire Marshal's office.

Executive Positions - Election – will take place at June meeting. President, VP for each county (Westmorland, Kent, Albert), ATC Rep, NBAFPO Rep, Secretary, Treasurer. Looking for people with strong leadership skills to come forward and take on these positions. President and Secretary positions are not re-offering.

ATC Report – Daniel Dupuis

Level 1

A firefighter level 2 is starting in Cap Pele on Monday. There are still a few spots open if any are interested. Dennis Metcalfe will be teaching.

Spring Training

Our annual spring training will be coming up in June. We will be having a training committee meeting to discuss venue and options. If you have any ideas or suggestions, please pass them along. There have been discussions of a possible auto ex workshop including a motor coach bus. We will discuss this further at the next training committee meeting (to be scheduled).

Officer Training

We hosted a Fire Officer 1 course in Riverview. The course went well. Special thanks to retired Deputy Chief Don McCabe for co-teaching with me on this course.

Dave reminded the group that it is important that the departments inform Daniel if they are conducting an in-house Level 1 course.

Mike Nicholson spoke about an Atlantic regional competition for auto extrication. Would like to host a competition next year.

Dave suggested coordinating another electric bus session.

NBAFPO – Tim Dryden

- Had a meeting in Fredericton on Feb 17. Most discussions are around the seminar Apr 6-8 in Fredericton. Site location not confirmed but could be the Fredericton Inn. Last year it was at the Best Western but the venue was too small and did not have enough meeting space.
 Speakers will be Milt Cawley, Brian McBain from Underwriters, Corp. Kevin Pung – lab talk, OFM and DNR.
- Some discussions still going on with former secretary/treasurer. Their balance is now over \$8K.
- Seem to be more organized and positive in the meetings.

- Still lining things up for the seminar.
- Hiring translators this year for the first time. Cost is over \$3,000 for this service for the weekend.
- Really trying to get more participation in the Association.
- Looking for sponsorship for the nutrition breaks (morning and afternoon) for all three days. \$150 from each Association. The Fredericton Inn does not allow outside food to be brought in. All catering to go through them.
- Fire Chief for a day was in Balmoral and was well attended. The only issue the Association had was the OFM sent an invoice to the NBAFPO for the cost of the bunker suit for the student. They used to have sponsors to cover the cost but did not have one this year.

OFM – Raymond Leblanc

Truck Committee meeting – received fire truck specs back from Saint John and reviewed their changes (not many). Ready to go for Tender. Peter Kavanagh is putting the final touches on the report and it will be sent out (it is possible it may have already been sent). Rescues went out for Tender in Nov 2017.

Jim Hayter Memorial Scholarship







Established in 2017 to honor the late Jim Hayter, a charter member of the Canadian Volunteer Fire Services Association (CVFSA). Chief Hayter was also a firefighter with the Alvinston, Ontario Fire Department for 44 years, 15 of which he served as Fire Chief. In addition to his dedication to the Fire Services, Chief Hayter was extremely active in the community including serving as Deputy Mayor.

Eligible applicants are CVFSA members or dependent children of members who are pursuing their goal of higher education under the age of 25.

Applicants must be in process or have been accepted at an accredited university or college to pursue a course of study which will lead to a recognized degree.

The award which shall be given to one applicant per year: \$1,500.00

The awarding of the scholarship will be based on the involvement of the applicant with their school and community and also the academic standing of the applicant.
