- **Website citation:** "Title of Article," Website Title, Publisher/Sponsor, Date Published, URL



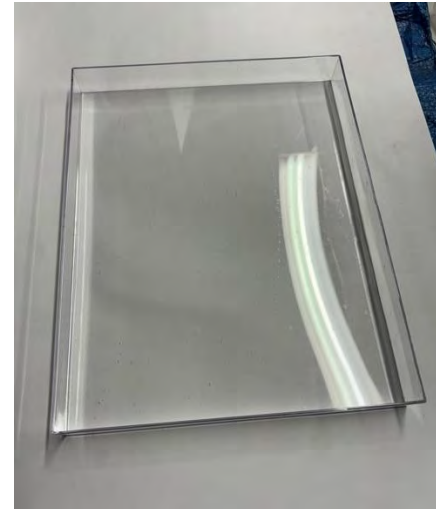

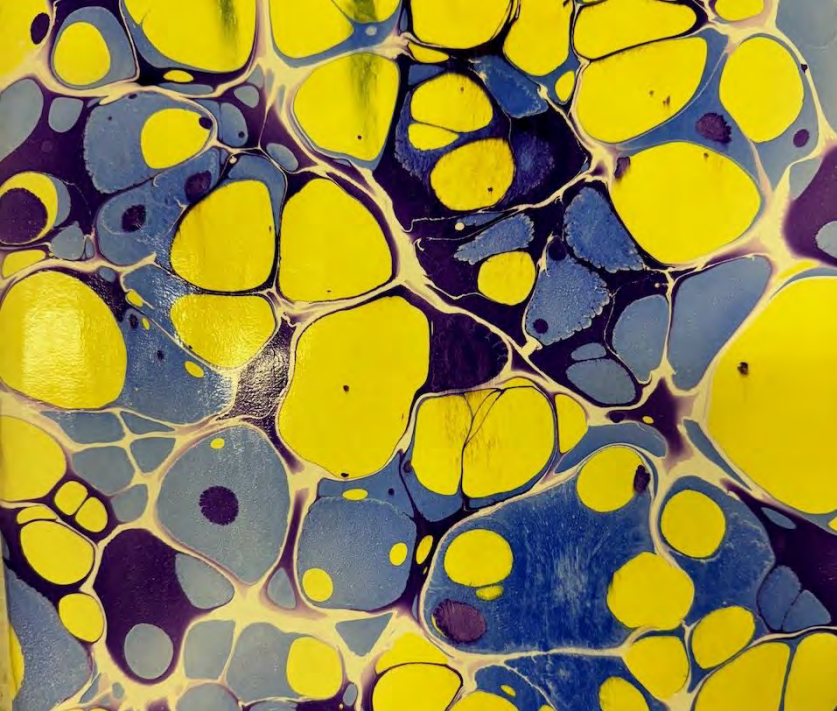
