



Notes from Fr. Vincent:

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

"If you want to bring happiness to the whole world, go home and love your family." (St. Mother Teresa)

On this day within the octave of Christmas, we honor the holy family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. In honoring them, we honor all families big or small. And in honoring all families, we honor the family of God, the Church. But most especially we focus in on the hidden day-to-day life of the Holy Family of Nazareth.

Today's feast is a celebration of family – the unique nucleus of society that gives us life, nurture and support throughout our journey on earth. Families are the first and best places for the love of God to come alive.

A little boy greets his father as he returns from work with a question: "Daddy, how much do you make an hour?" The father is surprised and says, "Look, son, not even your mother knows. Don't bother me now, I'm tired." "But Daddy, just tell me please! How much do you make an hour?" the boy insists. The father finally gives up and replies, "Twenty dollars." "Okay, Daddy," the boy continues, "Could you loan me ten dollars?" The father yells at him, "So that was the reason you asked how much I earn, right? Now, go to sleep and don't bother me anymore!" At night the father thinks over what he said and starts feeling guilty. Maybe his son needed to buy something. Finally, he goes to his son's room. "Are you asleep, son?" asks the father. "No, Daddy. Why?" replies the boy. "Here's the money you asked for earlier," the father said. "Thanks, Daddy!" replies the boy and receives the money. The he reaches under his pillow and brings out some more money. "Now I have enough! Now I have twenty dollars!" says the boy to his father, "Daddy, could you sell me one hour of your time?" Today's readings have a message for this man and for all of us, and the message is that we need to invest more of our time in our family life.

On this feast day let us offer our own families and all their members on the altar to ask God's blessing on them and to obtain for them the guidance of the Holy Family. Let us pray that through the intercession of Holy Family, we may make our families happy and cheerful Christian homes.

Prayer: "Holy Family, we consecrate ourselves and our family to you. May we be completely united in a love that is lasting, faithful and open to the gift of new life. Help us to grow in virtue, to forgive one another from our hearts, and to live in peace all our days. Amen"

He was also arrested for being too much of a Catholic. He gave many tips and insights on how we can invite one back who has lost his/her way from the Church. He advised us to be a "greeting person". Don't be afraid to start a conversation with a stranger and be bold in faith. So with that said, about your kids and grandkids. He is a Campus Minister too and gave advice from experience on developing a good Catholic sense about kids. If you want them to be like everyone else's let them do it. If you want them to be different then do something very different. Faith fill your children now for they can't love what they don't know. Aim for their heart and their head will follow. Win the trust of your children.

So now for the resolutions that are besides yourself. Here are Marcel's ten tips to raise kids Catholic.

- 1. Keep a good marriage. Love each other. God first then spouse then children
- 2. Pray together every day as a family. Just do something. Start with morning prayer, meal prayer with intentions, night prayer, instill prayer in their day
- 3. Prioritize your time together. Quantity is not quality. Make time together count and meaningful.
- 4. Participate in the Sacraments together. Especially Mass and confession together. They must know.
- 5. Eat together as much as you can.
- 6. Discipline your kids. Grace happens when undeserved. Borders and boundaries keep them safe. Explain consequences either way.
