

Notes from Fr. Vincent:

The Ascension of the Lord

Leonardo da Vinci had started to work on a large canvas in his studio. For a while, he worked at it choosing the subject, planning the perspective, sketching the outline, and applying the colors, with his own inimitable genius. Then suddenly he ceased, the painting still unfinished, and summoning one of his students, invited him to complete the work. The student protested that he was both unworthy and unable to complete the great painting, which the master had begun. But da Vinci silenced him. "Will not what I have done inspire you to do your best?" Jesus our Master began His Good News two thousand years ago by what he said, by what he did, and supremely by what He suffered. He illustrated His message and, has left us to complete the picture.

The Ascension is the culmination of the Lord's mission beginning with his incarnation through public ministry, suffering death and resurrection. But it is not the end of His mission in the world not is it the cessation of his presence amidst us. He is taken up to heaven only to be present in our midst in a different form and continue his mission through his spirit-filled followers.

It is now up to each baptized Christian to continue the presence of Christ and his mission by being his hands, feet, eyes, ears, heart and mouth. Today, on the mount of the Ascension, Jesus entrusts to us his life, his Gospel of healing, compassion, reconciliation and hope. Having given his life to reveal the love of God for all of us, he entrusts that work to you and me.

Prayer: Lord, may my life be a convincing witness to you and grant me the grace that it may never be a counter-witness. Amen

Adult Education Notes

The Marian Conference was another great opportunity to increase our awareness and understanding about our Mother Mary and listen to some great speakers about different subjects of Church Primacy, St. Joseph, Papal Authority, Perpetual Eucharistic Revival and it's works, and conversion stories of priests and laity. We had beautiful Masses with striking homilies and great reverent Adorations! Here are some summaries.

Primacy of the Church: We must remember that in the end Our Lady's Immaculate Heart will Triumph! The Holy Spirit gives us the power to protect our Holy Church-the Bride of Christ. Mass is the contemplation of the mystery of the cross which cannot be exhausted. The mystery cannot be explained but continues in mystery. Thru the Easter Season we continue to carry our cross with Christ for if there is no sacrifice of the Cross there is no Resurrection to rejoice in our salvation. Don't push the Lord away when He brings the Cross to you.

Mary's heart is a place of grace and peace. The Soul of Mary is pure light. She is full of the Holy Spirit her Spouse. When you look into Mary's eyes, it's the Holy Spirit looking back at you. Fight distraction in prayer. Dismiss it and refocus. When you pray pay attention to every word. Take it into your heart.

Papal authority is difficult. Each one is different but their purpose is each the same—teaching the Word of Christ and protecting Christ's Church. Their agenda must be of Truth proclaimed to the people. It must not be political and their greatness conflict is indifference. The mystery of the Holy Father should be a well-spring that never runs dry. And God's well of mercy given thru them is indefinite. Because Christ gave Peter alone the Keys of the Kingdom, he alone was chosen by God as the leader of the Church. This set him apart from the other Apostles who later received their priestly commission when Jesus breathed on them after the Resurrection. Jesus chose Peter at Cesarea Philippi with the pagan backdrop to tell them He is Lord only and nothing will prevail against His Church/ Kingdom. The Pope must safeguard Christ's Church—not change it to his image of it. The Pope is over ONE BILLION souls and is responsible for... every one of them. What a Cross he himself must accept and bear for each one of us. Pray for the Holy Father.


