#### **Notes from Fr. Vincent:**

#### Corpus Christi

"The Holy Eucharist is the center and culmination of Christian life" (Lumen Gentium, 11).

The former archbishop of San Francisco, John Quinn, loves to tell the story of the arrival of Mother Teresa and her Missionaries of Charity to open their house in the city. Poor Archbishop Quinn had gone to great efforts to make sure that their convent was, while hardly opulent, quite comfortable. He recalls how Mother Teresa arrived and immediately ordered the carpets removed, the telephones, except for one, pulled out of the wall, the beds, except for the mattresses taken away, and on and on. Explained Mother Teresa to the baffled archbishop, "All we really need in our convent is the tabernacle" (Cardinal Timothy M. Dolan in Priests of the Third Millennium, 2000 p. 218).

Many bodies are broken through the use of brute force and torture; much blood is shed of innocent people and children. Violence leads to hatred and more violence. Today we hear of someone whose broken body brought us peace, who shed his blood to bring us God's forgiveness and love. Every Eucharist is a message of hope that the love of God is with us now and forever. The Eucharist is the sign of Jesus' abiding presence amidst us; as he says, "whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him" (Jn 6/56). Let us thank God today for the gift of Jesus' Eucharist.

As today's feast is intended to make us value and appreciate the worth of Jesus in the Eucharist, let ask ourselves if we are thankful to God for this great gift. How has my participation in the Eucharist helped me to become a happy and holy person?

Prayer: Break me, Lord, and use me to build up Your kingdom. Amen

Of all our vices there is none which stops more souls on the road to piety than pride. And in trying to please, God and man their ambition is covered under the appearance of honesty and charity. They end up displeasing God and failing to please man. We are made for heaven, not earthly approval, spending our energy, pleasing others exhausts us, and we have so little left over for Our Savior.

Only when we offer our hearts to Jesus, will we find the dignity and approval that we so long for that man cannot give. Where has self pride kept you from loving Jesus? Where has the desire for others been greater than the desire for Jesus? Do you care more what others think of you than what God thinks of you? Are you tired of performing for others just for a nod or word of praise when you have Jesus's attention constantly? Put your pride out.

In this month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, what better time is it than to re-examine our love for God, the Son – His Body and Blood given for you – just YOU—out of His unconditional love. Concentrate on what matters most. Receive the grace and strength to believe the True Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist-Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. What are you lacking to follow the heart of Jesus?


