

Notes from Fr. Vincent:

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

There is a story of a chaplain who was serving on the battlefield. He came across a young man who was lying in a shell hole, seriously wounded. "Would you like me to read something from this book, the Bible?" he asked. "I'm so thirsty, I'd rather have a drink of water." The soldier said. Hurrying away, the chaplain soon brought the water. Then the wounded man said, "Could you put something under my head?" The chaplain took off his overcoat, rolled it up, and gently placed it under the man's head for a pillow. "Now," said the suffering man, "if I just had something over me, I'm feeling cold." The chaplain immediately removed his jacket and put it over the wounded man to keep him warm. Then the soldier looked the chaplain straight in the eye and said, "If there is anything in that book that makes a man do for another all that you have done for me, then please read it, because I'd love to hear it."

If my actions do not speak of gospel values, be sure my words never will. What affects most people is often caught rather than taught. Indeed, we are the only book on Jesus Christ that others may ever get to read!

When Jesus sends out his disciples, they are not sent with powerful means to impress people with or to buy their allegiance. No force, no money, not even people who are influential, renowned and learned. Just simple disciples, ordinary people. They have to go out with no other riches than the Good News of Jesus, his message of joy to the poor. They also should not be choosy to whom they go: in all simplicity they present themselves to anyone willing to listen, depending on the goodwill of people and their hospitality. Let us become missionaries of Jesus by the way we live. Let us be part of the 72 he sends out.

I sincerely thank you all for making the DDF program in our parishes a great success with more participation and contributions this year. The leadership of Ron Wesbecher and Dennis James from St. John Parish and Gina Bueter from St. Anthony Parish in organizing this program is highly appreciated and recognized.

Prayer: Lord, disarm us of all fears and anxieties as we labor in your vineyard. Amen.

Adult Education Notes

Today we think about the 72 disciples Jesus chose to send out to the people and proclaim His kingdom. He gave them remarkable ability to have the authority as He had to cure diseases, the lame, the blind, and to drive out demons. Can you imagine what these disciples witnessed in doing all these miracles? What they saw and felt as ordinary men and the next day miracle workers?

We may not be like those blessed disciples but these kind of miracles are happening every day somewhere where great faith is revealed. Have you heard of Sr. Briege McKenna? God blessed her with healing gifts. She has witnessed great healing especially in poor areas where there is no medicine-no doctors-no nothing to help.

She recounts while in Mexico in one of the poorest of the poor villages the miracles were in great abundance where Mass was said and prayers lifted up. A young boy was found burned severely in a rubbish pile. Sister instructed the woman to put him under the altar during Mass. After Mass the boy was not there and she asked his whereabouts. The woman pointed to him. Sh did not recognize him except his few clothes he had on. He was healed. No sign of burns. She said Jesus showed up. Many others miracles happened during that Mass because the faith of the people cried to Jesus for help.

She said that the people truly believed in the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and their faith in that was all that was needed. Jesus shows up when great faith abounds. God is truly generous when we believe. Going before the Holy Eucharist, before God in His house brings more than graces, more than faith, but power in peace that all it takes is true faith and belief that He can answer prayer. He hears all of them. What you ask must be His Will. It must be in His time. It must be in His Way.

What we ask in our humanity may not be what is best for us or the best way to receive of our prayers. You know the saying—Sometimes God says YES- sometimes He says NO-Sometimes He says NOT NOW (wait). The waiting is what is hard. Looking and watching for His Will to happen. But this strengthens us. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are active in all of God's Will. The Trinity always works together-never separately. Keep faithful. Keep vigilant. Keep trusting that God will show up and grant your prayer in a way that is better than you can imagine and the fruits of your prayer may benefit not only you (or maybe not) but someone who truly needs it from your prayerful heart. Be still and know that I am God. Ps 46:10. Behold, I Am with you always even to the end of the age. Matt 28:20


