

Notes from Fr. Vincent:

Second Sunday of Advent

"The confession of evil works is the first beginning of good works." (St. Augustine)

The Romans sometimes tied a captive face-to-face with a dead body and kept him in a dungeon until the horrible secretions of the dead one's putrefying body destroyed the life of the living victim. Virgil describes this cruel punishment: "The living prisoners and the dead were coupled and tied together, face to face, body to body, until the wretched prisoners pined away and died." Without the pardon and forgiveness of sins by Christ, our bodies, too, are shackled to a soul dead by mortal sins.

In today's gospel, John the Baptist urges us to repent. The call to repentance is a call to conversion, to have a new heart, to discover our authentic selves. We cannot do this unless we are willing to change when we find things we set hearts on and the persons we associate with are unhelpful for our true growth. And when we realize that our past actions and attitudes were wrong, that they have caused pain and suffering to others our tears become spontaneous and eloquent. In such situation real conversion germinates within us and a new heart begins to bloom.

Advent invites us to clear the paths cluttered by sin, bitterness, or fear, so Christ can enter more deeply into our lives. As we wait for His coming, let us commit to conversion, to kindness, and to hope, becoming signs of God's peace in our world.

This Monday, we celebrate Mary, conceived without sin, prepared by God from the very beginning to be the pure dwelling place for His Son. Her Immaculate Conception reminds us that God's grace always goes before us, shaping our lives in ways we may not yet see. Mary's 'yes' shows what grace can do in a willing heart. As we honor her, let us ask for the courage to say our own 'yes' to God each day, so Christ may be born anew in our lives and in our world.

Prayer: Lord, in Your mercy, soften my heart and lead me to true repentance, that I may turn from sin and walk faithfully in Your grace. Amen.

We are already in the second week of Advent. How's your "waiting and anticipating" going? Sometimes we get so focused on Christmas we forget the rich and numerous blessings that comes our way through spiritual preparation and prayer. That is why we NEED Advent. "If there is no Advent, then Christmas is not adequately experienced. If you do not experience the message of Advent and therefore do not LOOK for Jesus to come. then do not be surprised that Christmas seems to slip by without leaving a mark on your soul".

There are several devotions in Church and you can use podcasts. websites, and just reading the first Chapter of Luke in the Bible to put your mind in the right spirit of Jesus's coming. Do something!

Take a way: Maybe God is tapping at your conscience this year to do more than last year? What do you long for to change this Christmas and into the New Year? What needs to change? If God sent Gabriel to you, would you say "yes" to what He asks off you without hesitation?

Is God asking something of you right now in your ordinary life? Is there something you need to relinquish control of and let God be in control? Or is God trying to do something extraordinary in your life and you are holding back, not trusting? Does He just need you to cooperate? Does He just need you to listen and say yes?

Most of us are not ready to step out and do something better for God, but hold back thinking I'm not adequate, not courageous enough, not worthy enough. You are better than you give yourself credit for. Like Mother Theresa said, "God doesn't ask us to be successful. He just wants us to be faithful."

Giving is an essential part of wholeness. It is not in the giving that we are blessed but in the gift that is received from you that they are. The littlest thing can become the biggest joy. All talent, time, love is gift from God and when we share what we have Jesus is in the midst of it. Give one thing from the heart this Advent to prepare for the greatest gift of Love which is Jesus. You can do it. Simply give.

Share who Jesus is to you. What He has done for you. What He is doing in you and through you. A personal testimony brings more people to God than any other way. People want sincere truth about faith. Your words about Jesus and your life may be just what they need to hear. Share! "People must know."
