Notes from Fr. Vincent:

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

A judge was constantly ridiculed by a conceited lawyer. When asked by a friend why the Judge did not rebuke the lawyer, the judge replied: "In our town there lives a widow who has a dog. And whenever the moon shines, it goes outside and barks all night." After that, the judge shifted the conversation to another subject. Finally, someone asked, "But what about the dog and the moon?." "Oh, he replied, "the moon goes on shining, that's all."

Light is the key word that we find in the first and third readings of today. We know that the function of light is to shine, to illumine. The light of faith which we have received is not to be kept hidden but to shine and spread around.

Just like light which illuminates, guides and gives warmth, just like salt that purifies, preserves and gives taste, our Christian life is meant to enkindle the goodness in others and promote its growth. In the first reading, Isaiah said, "Then shall your light break forth." It happens when you share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, cover him and do not hide yourself from your own flesh, then shall your light break forth like dawn, and your healing shall spring up speedily.

In short, we are to be always instruments of peace, warmth, love, trust, confidence, respect, dignity, care and concern.

Prayer: Father of eternal light. I thank YOU for sharing YOUR light with me; enable me to make it shine before men and women for YOUR glory. Amen.

Adult Education Notes

How will you be a 'Witness' to your faith during Lent? Have you started to think about it yet? Getting yourself psyched up yet? Yep I said that. Lent is a time to reset, reimagine, rethink your life with God. It's a time for going deeper inside with prayer, fasting, works of mercy, and sacrifice to help you see closer the mystery of the Lord's Passion, Crucifixion, Death, and most eagerly, his Resurrection.

We are very familiar with the story, and if we go deeper and think humbly about the people in that story, with their flaws and strengths alike, we can see ourselves in every one of them. Lent calls us to take up our cross with Christ to Calvary. It calls us to a time of awakening, decisive action, boldness, and witness through charity and action.

Suggestion for you: watch and pay attention to the characters-individuals and/or groups-who play a part in the divine drama of Christ's eternal offering. I invite you to step into that sacred story-to walk alongside those who were there, feel as if you could reach out and touch them. They are a mix of saints and sinners, heroes and villains.

Some follow Jesus all the way to Calvary; others turn away in their fear or betrayal. Some recognize him immediately and others cannot see him at all. Some act with love and courage; others lash out with cruelty and indifference. And if we are honest, we can find pieces of ourselves in all of them.

We are Peter, bold in our declarations of loyalty but quick to deny when the pressure mounts.

We are Pilate, torn between what we know is right and the fear of losing human approval.

We are the weeping women of Jerusalem, moved with compassion yet unsure how to help.

We are the Roman Centurion, surprised into belief by the sheer force of what we witness.

We are Simon of Cyrene, drawn into the suffering of Christ when we least expect it.

The Passion is more than a historical account – it's a mirror. In its scenes, we see our own faith tested, our own love revealed, our own hearts laid bare before God. Drawing from the Churches rich tradition, we can imagine what may or might have been and freely examine our own hearts. And in every encounter, we find the same Lord, who turned doubters into disciples and sinners into saints still at work in the human soul today. (Did you see you yet?)

How will you be a 'witness' this Lent? Only 40 days will tell. Challenge accepted? I hope so. Prayers 4 U
