

Notes from Fr. Vincent:

6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday's readings remind us that God looks beyond outward actions to the heart. Sirach speaks of our freedom to choose life, St. Paul points to the Spirit's deeper wisdom, and Jesus calls us to go beyond merely keeping rules by transforming our thoughts, desires, and intentions. True discipleship is not just avoiding sin but loving God sincerely from within, choosing each day the path that leads to life and peace.

We begin the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday. Pope Benedict XVI often described Lent as a grace-filled journey of inner renewal, a time to return to God with the whole heart through prayer, fasting, and charity. He taught that these practices are not mere external acts but ways of opening ourselves to God's love, purifying our hearts, and learning to live more deeply in Christ. For him, Lent is like a spiritual pilgrimage that leads us with hope to Easter, where through the Cross we rediscover the joy of new life in the risen Lord.

Ashes we receive on Wednesday have twofold meaning. First, they are a sign of our repentance. They say that we are sorry for our sins and will do penance for them during Lent. Second, they are a sign of our mortality. They say that we will die someday and have to give an account of our lives to God. Let us ask ourselves what kind of penance we can do to make this Lent more meaningful and appealing to God.

As Lent is a season of grace from God let us use this season for forging our relationship with God and others through prayer, fasting and almsgiving." ***What we have lost through sin, let us regain through penance; and let us prepare our souls for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery by fasting, prayer, and works of mercy.***" (St. Leo the Great)

Prayer: Lord, as we journey through Lent, soften my heart, purify my soul through prayer and sacrifice, and lead me closer to You in love and trust. Amen

Adult Education Notes

Wednesday is the beginning of Lent. Have you decided your offering, your fasting, your suffering for the next 40 days? Don't wait for the last minute or after. Pray about it. Prayer changes things.

I was watching a speaker at the Napa Institute and he talked about suffering. We have our own trials, burdens and pain. We think ours is the worst of all but there has never been any pain as that of our Lord's passion. "Doce me passionem tuam" -Teach me your suffering. His talk echoed this phrase. He said His exterior wounds were as paper cuts per se compared to the interior pain and suffering He experienced inside because of my sins and your sins.

He recommended that we could not honor all the wounds we see with enough love. He said to sit in Adoration and ask Jesus to show you just one of His wounds. Invite Him in the language of a most trusting child to sit with you, without fear, to hold your hand as you sit in the pew and you hold His bloody hand and put your finger in the wound there as St. Thomas did and press your hand into His. Contemplate that one single wound and see the dark colored coagulated blood mixed with dirt. See the bruising and the splinters caused by the wood of the Cross.

Touch the hand. Kiss the wound. Our Lord really does want to be that close to us. Doce me passionem tuam-teach me your suffering. It's a journey of the heart not of the intellect. It's a process we all have to go through to find the paradoxical of the secret of happiness. It's not of ease and comfort but of unity with Christ on the Cross. Doce me passionem tuam-teach me your suffering.

Think of the most difficult and anguish suffering you have ever endured. Christ was with you in it. He weeps for you from the Cross. He endured that suffering and much more. St. Bernard of Clairvaux asked Jesus what was the greatest wound He had that was not recorded by man. Jesus said," I had on my shoulder while I bore My Cross on the way of sorrows, the most grievous wound that was more painful than the others."

You need something to pray about? Pick a wound of Christ's body and meditate on how He got that wound. Think of the Cross which was not smooth and clean but raw and rough and full of splinters for His hands and shoulder. Pick the Crown of Thorns. Pick His bare feet. Pick His scourged back. Pick His bruised and swollen face. There is no place on His body not torn or marked. Doce me passionem tuam teach me your suffering. Don't hesitate this Lent to carry your Crosses with Christ uniting your suffering with His with no complaint but with inner joy. This Lent pray these four words— Doce me passionem tuam—teach me your suffering.
