ALIVE WITH PURPOSE!

"When you live for a strong purpose, then hard work isn't an option. It's a necessity."—Steve Pavlina

"Don't judge my problems when you don't know my purpose. I'm only struggling now, so I can pull you through later."—Bishop Noel Jones

A colleague of mine who pastors a church in Amarillo lives by the personal motto, **ALIVE WITH PURPOSE!** When he makes the statement, he is very animated and speaks with such vigor, because he truly means what he says. One of my favorite books on this topic is Rick Warren's work, *Purpose-Driven Life*. In it, he discusses what drives your life, understanding that life is a temporary assignment and the reason for everything. He invites the reader to deeply reflect on being transformed by trouble, growing through temptation, embracing your earthly assignment, using your gifts/giftedness, and finding balance in your life. It is a guide to a 40-day spiritual journey to discover your purpose with a new awareness that **you are a "puzzle piece"** in the **big picture called LIFE**.

At some point in our lives, we all will wrestle with the question of purpose and meaning. Years ago, I had an opportunity to walk with a close cousin, as he began to embrace his own purpose. He was a naturally gifted musician who was also classically trained. At the tender age of three, he went to the piano in their home and began to play gospel songs. We all were amazed with how he played the piano and melodiously sang. When he was 22 years old, he was in a serious struggle because of family expectations versus being authentic to where he truly was in his own spirituality and life journey. He was in the process of "becoming." He was a person of faith, and there was a lot of pressure from his family to live out the family's religious tradition. But the issue for him was the incongruence from his ever evolving theology and philosophy of life. He came to me seeking guidance and understanding amid the intense wrestling in his mind and soul. I shared with him personal experiences which shaped me in my struggle with purpose and meaning. Steve Maraboli informed some of my thinking. He said, "We all make mistakes, have struggles, and even regret things in our past. But you are not your mistakes, you are not your struggles, and you are here NOW with the power to shape your day and your future." (red emphasis is mine) We need to remember that life is like photography. You need the negatives to develop into the person you are destined and purposed to become. Too often when we get beat up by life's circumstances, we get in survival mode when we should be in a thriving mode. Laura Gleisberg said, "There is purpose in struggle because it unleashes your full power. You are being pushed to thrive." It is time for each of us to develop the mentality that I am ALIVE WITH PURPOSE! If you place your hand over your heart, you can feel a heartbeat. That is called PURPOSE! The heartbeat means you are ALIVE WITH PURPOSE so don't ever give up! George Lincoln Rockwell said it best, "The purpose of life is to struggle as hard as you can

Committee meetings will be held following worship (before, during, after our fellowship meal) on Third Sundays.
