STAY ON THE WHEEL!

"If you don't like something, change it; if you can't change it, change the way you think about it."—Mary Engelbroit

"There is a God shape vacuum in the heart of every man (woman) which cannot be filled by any created thing, but only by God, the Creator, made known through Jesus."—Blaise Pascal

There are probably many inspirational stories about the Potter's Wheel that can deeply impact our lives. Today, I would like to share one with you, it is the story the tea-cup. It begins with a couple who went to England to celebrate their 25th wedding anniversary and shopped at a beautiful antique store. They both liked antiques and pottery, especially tea-cups, and so spotting an exceptional cup, they asked, "May we see that? We've never seen a cup quite so beautiful."

As the owner of the shop handed it to them, suddenly the tea-cup spoke, "You don't understand." It said, "I have not always been a tea-cup. There was a time when I was a lump of red clay. My master took me and rolled me, pounded me and patted me over and over. I yelled out, don't do that. I don't like it! Let me alone."

But my master only smiled and gently said, "Not yet!" Then, WHAM! I was placed on a spinning wheel, and suddenly, I was spun around and around. I screamed, "STOP IT! IAM GETTING SO DIZZY! I'M GOING TO BE SICK!" But the master only nodded and quietly responded, "Not yet." He spun me and poked and prodded and bent me out of shape to suit himself, and then he put me in the oven. I never felt such heat. I yelled and knocked and then POUNDED at the door, "HELP! GET ME OUT OF HERE! Again, the master said, "Not yet." When I thought I couldn't bear it another minute, the door opened. He carefully took me out and put me on the shelf, and I began to cool. I said to myself, "Oh, that feels so good. This is much better." But after I cooled, he picked me up and he brushed and painted me all over. The fumes were horrible. I cried out, 'Oh please, STOP IT! STOP IT!'

The master shook his head again and said, Not yet."

Then suddenly he put me back in the oven. Only it was not like the first time. This time it was twice as hot, and I just knew I would suffocate. I begged, pleaded, screamed, as I cried out. I was convinced I would never survive the heat. I was ready to give up, and just then the door opened, and he took me out and again placed me on the shelf where I cooled and waited and lasaid, 'That's not me, that couldn't be me. It's beautiful!' Quietly, my master spoke, 'I want you to remember, then, I know it hurt to be rolled and pounded and patted, but had I just left you alone, you'd have dried up. I know it made you dizzy to spin around on the wheel, but if I had stopped, you would have crumbl

At some point in our lives, each of us have been on the potter's wheel undergoing a creation/transformation process. I would dare say that most of us are probably still on the wheel. The designing, shaping, and molding that we must undergo can be very painstaking in order for us to become the finished product of the Creator's design. There are many moments in our lives where we probably were like the tea-pot yelling, screaming, and questioning God/Providence/Fate, "What are you doing to me? I am reminded of the quote of Elder Jeffrey R. Holland which says, "Though we may feel we are like a broken vessel, we must remember that vessel is in the hands of the divine potter." I can identify many moments in my life where I thought I knew a better road, or a better process to progress in my life's journey, but all I did was make matters worse. We need to he words of Kenny Gatlin, "We need to stop trying to get God to fit into our mold and start fitting into His." (Kenny Gatlin Ministries). It would behoove us to trust the process and design for our lives and just STAY ON THE WHEEL! We all have significant stressors which impact us (normal everyday stressors and the unexpected and unusual ones like COVID-19 and the civil unrest in our country). But regardless of the stressors and how deeply we may be impacted, each of the painful circumstances are part of our process of BECOMING... Whatever is in the mind of the Creator/Divine/ Providence/Fate, it will come to fruition as long as we undergo the process of creation and transformation. Today, we are being invited to TRUST what is occurring, just STAY ON THE WHEEL!

This is the word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord: "Go down to the potter's house, and there I will give you my message." So I went down to the potter's house, and I saw him working at the wheel. But the pot he was shaping from the clay was marred in his hands; so the potter formed it into another pot, shaping it as seemed best to him... 6/ Can I not do with you, Israel, as this potter does?" declares the Lord. "Like clay in the hand of the potter, so are you in my hand, Israel." (Jeremiah 18:1-6)

Rhubarb Matramonial Bars

Crust:

1 ½ C. Flour

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. baking soda

1 ½ c. Oatmeal

1 C/ Brown sugar (packed)

34 Butter

8 C. Cut up Rhubarb

1 C. Sugar (coating Rhubarb)

Put ³/₄ of crust mixture on bottom of 9 x 12 pan.

Then pour sugar coated rhubarb, then top with remaining crust mixture.

Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour.
