Approval of Minutes from March 27, 2026, Town Board Meeting

Public Comment:

Cook County Sheriff Police Commander Busching addressed the Board. She indicated that in April, they focus on Distracted Driving enforcement, throughout the surrounding communities, including the Township. They have seen reductions as a result of their patrols. In a few months, the focus will be Directed Enforcement.

Supervisor's Report:

Supervisor Nasca relayed the following:

There is one ongoing GA case and none pending.

Michelle's Crafts and Cards class was held on April 23. Her next classes are scheduled for May 28, June 10, and July 15 at 12:00 p.m.

The Cook County Sheriff's Office conducted a Cyber Safety Presentation on April 16 at the Township. 28 residents attended and shared positive feedback regarding the information they received.

Community Kindness Day is April 25. The Township has been collecting food donations which will be distributed to local pantries on Monday.

Residents in the unincorporated area have called in to report a string of six streetlights out on the parkway on the south side of Bryn Mawr between Crescent and Courtland.

The Township is still waiting to hear from Cook County on whether a replacement was appointed to the vacant position open on the Norwood Park Lighting District Board.

The Township received a call from a resident in the unincorporated area reporting a tree branch down on Seminole. There is a large portion of the branch still attached to the tree, so a tree contractor will need to be contacted to prepare an estimate regarding removal of the branch.

Eisenhower Library is hosting their Annual Wellness Fair on Saturday, May 9 from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Harwood Heights FOP Lodge #172 will be hosting their 3rd Annual Golf Outing at White Pines Golf Club in Bensenville on Monday, June 22. The fee is \$150 per golfer, \$600 per foursome with additional opportunities for sponsorship.

Trustee Di Piero (Building Maintenance & Veterans Committee) stated he had nothing to report.

Trustee Wyda (Senior Citizens & Disability Committee) reported that 4 cab books were sold in April.

Assessor's Report:

Assessor Karns stated the initial deadline to file property tax exemptions was April 21. He added that currently the applications for property assessment appeals with the Cook County Assessor are open and that the 2nd installment for the 2025 property tax bills will most likely be sent out later than usual.

Highway Commissioner's Report:

Highway Commissioner Alongi reported his department has been repairing potholes in the unincorporated area and that the work has been completed.
