Ashland Fire Department

The Ashland New Hampshire Fire Department was organized in 1894. This coincided with the town's purchase and construction of a water system to supply the community. The fire department's first fire station, which also housed the library and town offices, was built in 1895.



Ashland Library

The Ashland Town Library has a history intertwined with the town's development. Established by a special meeting vote in May 1870, the library initially shared space in the Town Hall, which was completed in 1871. It was later moved to the Fire Department until it moved into its current building, the Scribner Memorial, in 1939, where it remains.
