The Craft of Cross Stitch in a Digital Design World


The process of craft to me is like breathing. It is the **inhalation of inspiration** and the **exhalation of application**.

This elements of this Mister Rogers themed cross stitch are displayed together to **demonstrate the intricate simplicity** that goes into a cross stitch project.


Created as a birthday present for my sister, this quote is meant to be both nostalgic And inspiring as she completes high school.

2 ply DMC Floss | Bucilla needle

To add dimension to the letters, two different shades of DMC plum floss are combined and threaded through a needle.

Because the weave of the canvas already has holes, a duller needle is used as to not create additional holes.

The floss is wrapped around a plastic spool to prevent knots and be easily transported.

Bucilla 6"x6" 14 ct. stretched Aida cloth

DMC thread in plum and light plum

Aida cloth is stretched over a square wooden frame to keep the canvas from distorting as it's being stitched,

The process of the stitching is calculated, time-consuming, and rhythmic: ilke a dance between the needle and the canvas where the pattern is the musical accompaniment.
