



His subjects included San Bernardino, Cajon Pass, and the seaport of New San Pedro (Wilmington). His camera captured images of the wild Mojave Desert and its travelers, crossroads, forts, soldiers, and watering holes at a moment in time that is gone forever.

Jeff Lapides is a Southern California photographer and book designer residing in Sierra Madre. During our January 24th MHS meeting, Lapides will talk about how he stumbled across the photographs that became The Mojave Road in 1863: The Pioneering Photographs of Rudolph d'Heureuse. 


