FIRE ON THE MOJAVE

Fire On the Mojave: Stories from the Deserts and Mountains of Inland Southern California is an award-winning project that takes a broad view of the role, presence and impacts of wildfire in our local desert and mountain regions.

Join the Mohave Historical Society on February 28th for a lively presentation with Q&A on the urgent topic of wildfire in our region. Our guest lecturer is College of the Desert Professor/Author and former BLM-USFS wildland firefighter Ruth Nolan.

The presentation will look at Native American uses of fire as a form of resource management; fire ecology/fire research conducted by leading scholars and experts in the field; interviews with regional firefighters; a showcase of community college Public Safety Academies; stories from citizens who've survived major wildfire events; emerging wildfire science; prevention, management, adaptations and preparations for future wildfire events; and a close-up view of the work of a wildland firefighter as seen through Nolan's point of view.

JANUARY RECAP




