II. Old Business:

- a. Reading of the Minutes. A motion was made by Gina Sawmiller to accept the minutes as posted on the website. The motion was seconded, and carried, by Gloria Combs.
- b. Treasurer's Report. Russ Smith reported these balances as of 5/1/25:
 1. Checking Account \$10,463.80
 2. Savings Account \$29,376.46
 3. Checking Account for NCD \$11,320.25
- c. A motion was made by Mike VanWassenhove and seconded by Gloria Combs to accept the report. Approved unanimously.

III. New Business

- a. NCD Trash Pickup
 - i. Russ Smith, Treasurer explained the new payment system
 - ii. Mike Gigli brought concerns about the April – September dates, and that he would like to see May – October to meet most part-time resident needs.
 - iii. Bonnie Kootz made a motion to change the semi-annual payment for the months of May through October. This motion was seconded by Darryl Sawmiller.
 - iv. Approved Unanimously. This will take effect on January 2026
- b. Stocking of Walleye
 - i. We have met our 3-year commitment for stocking Walleye.
 - ii. After accessing the size and quantity of the Walleye, the State recommended we stock 850, and a pre-vote was done at the 2024 Fall Meeting.
 - iii. Scott has ordered 850 for this year at a cost of \$3 each
- c. Weed Treatment/LARE Grant
 - i. Atwood Lake did receive the LARE Grant to help fund invasive weed (Curly Leaf/Milfoil) treatment.
 - ii. Scott Banfield found NO Milfoil on the lake as of now, and only a few areas on the West Side for Curly Leaf.
 - iii. Spraying will be done well before 4th of July so people can enjoy the water.
