Welcome Spring!

Included in this mailing are the 2019-2020 yearly assessment invoices, the official SLPOA Board of Director's application form for the July 2019 election, a copy of the 2019-2020 budget, notice of 2 rule changes plus the first two pages of the Spring edition of the Sunrise Lake Newsletter.

The 2019-2020 dues assessment remains the same as last year (\$725.00 for homes and \$550.00 for lots). Your invoice is included with this mailing. Payment is due on June 1, 2019.

The **DUES RAFFLE** is taking place right now. Tickets, which are available at the SLPOA office, are \$10 each or \$50 for 6. First prize is payment of the resident's 2019-2020 dues or 50% of the ticket sales to a max of \$725. No cash will be awarded as the winner will receive a credit to their account. Only residents in good standing can purchase tickets. Drawing will be held at the SLPOA office on May 15th at 3 pm. Good Luck!

Much needed repairs began on our pool. We expect the repairs and painting of both the main pool and baby pool to be completed in time for opening on Memorial Day weekend. In addition, we started a beautification project on the interior and exterior of the pool house. Our maintenance staff is busy with interior painting and exterior repairs and painting. We are excited for these long awaited upgrades. One of the changes the board made this year is replacing our landscaping service with in-house lawn care. We feel this will give us better control of the work and most importantly lower the cost. We purchased a commercial lawnmower and enclosed trailer for storage and transportation of equipment.

Additional maintenance projects include road sweeping, paving, road repair and maintenance, painting road lines, entrance and parking lines, replacing the culvert pipe under Wild Meadow for Rattlesnake Creek, weed cutting along the roads and tree canopy. We will also be filling potholes. Please call the office to report any potholes and we will add them to the "to be filled list".

Please remember if you are planning on cutting trees down on your property, you must obtain a permit from the office for all trees 3 inches in diameter or larger. There is no charge for this permit.

Any home construction projects (new construction, additions, decks, storage sheds, etc.) are required to follow all Dingman Township permitting processes as well as the SLPOA guidelines which can be found on our website in the Rules and Regula-

tions document or by contacting the SLPOA office. All resident vehicles must be registered with the office and display a sticker. EAGLE WATCH/PEEC

The Pocono Environmental Education Center (PEEC) offers a variety of educational programs and workshops for both children and adults and is conveniently located off Route 209 at 538 Emory Road, Dingmans Ferry Pa. Since it is practically at our back door, it is well worth taking a look at the variety of programs they offer.

Upcoming programs for the spring season include Peeper Search, Bicycle Riding on the McDade trail, Earth Day Festival, Fly Fishing, Fiber Arts, Bird Watching, to name a few. There is a Nature Adventure Camp for children and a Family Camp Weekend. In the winter, programs include Snow Shoeing and Eagle Watching.

Some of our residents got together and took advantage of the Eagle Watch offered this past January. We bundled up in our winter gear, grabbed our binoculars and cameras and met at the PEEC at 9 am on a Saturday. From there we were taken by van on an amazing adventure to see our magnificent eagles. We traveled down to Milford and across the river to NY state, went through High Point to Glen Spey and made several stops where eagles are known to nest. We saw eagles flying over a lake and eagles resting in trees. The scenery on the tour was just as magnificent as seeing the eagles. The drivers of the van are knowledgeable about the eagles, answered our questions and provided us with interesting stories and information. We all had a wonderful experience that day and would recommend that anyone interested in seeing eagles consider signing up for an eagle watch. Of course, 2 days after the watch I saw an eagle flying over the lake behind my own house!
