

God's Look at Man's Behavior

II. The Second Discourse (Habakkuk 1:12-2:20)

Habakkuk 2:1-20

A. Prophet: How can you use the **wicked** to get them? (Habakkuk 1:12-2:1)

Habakkuk 1:12-17

12 Art thou not from everlasting, O LORD my God, mine Holy One? we shall not die. O LORD, **thou hast ordained them for judgment**; and, O mighty God, **thou hast established them for correction.**

13 Thou art of purer eyes than to behold evil, and canst not look on iniquity: wherefore lookest thou upon them that deal treacherously, **and holdest thy tongue when the wicked devoureth the man that is more righteous than he?**

14 And makest men as the fishes of the sea, as the creeping things, that have no ruler over them?

15 They take up all of them with the angle, they catch them in their net, and gather them in their drag: **therefore they rejoice and are glad.**

16 Therefore they sacrifice unto their net, and burn incense unto their drag; because by them their portion is fat, and their meat plenteous.

17 Shall they therefore empty their net, and not spare continually to slay the nations?

1 I will stand upon my watch, and set me upon the tower, and will watch to see what he will say unto me, and **what I shall answer when I am reproved.**

* We left the prophet not agreeing with God but **deciding** to follow Him anyway!

B. God: Write down what **I say** - Judgment will come to an end (Habakkuk 2:2-3)

2 And the LORD answered me, and said, **Write the vision**, and make it **plain** (**baw-ar'** = **engrave**) upon **tables** (**loo'-akh** = stone, wood or **metal**), that he may run that readeth it.

3 For the vision is yet for an **appointed time**, but **at the end** (**after**) it shall speak, and not lie: though it tarry, **wait for it**; because it will surely come, it will not tarry.

a. Don't **Withdraw** (**quit**) - Don't get proud - The Just shall live by faith (Habakkuk 2:4)

1. Personal **Conviction**

4 Behold, his soul which is **lifted up** is not upright in him: **but the just** (**righteous**) shall live by his faith.

2. Personal **Control**

5 Yea also, because **he transgresseth by wine**, **he is a proud man**, neither keepeth at home, who enlargeth his desire as hell, and is as death, and cannot be satisfied, but gathereth unto him all nations, and heapeth unto him all people:

6 Shall not all these take up a parable against him, and a taunting proverb against him, and say, Woe to him that increaseth that which is not his! how long? and to him that ladeth himself with thick clay!(**This statement illudes to one taking lands that do not belong to them!**)

b. Don't Waver - I'll get the Chaldeans (Habakkuk 2:7-9)

1. Painful Certainty

7 Shall they not rise up suddenly that shall bite thee, and awake that shall vex thee, and thou shalt be for booties(plunder or spoil) unto them?

8 Because thou hast spoiled many nations, all the remnant of the people shall spoil thee; because of men's blood, and for the violence of the land, of the city, and of all that dwell therein.

2. Pitiless Covetousness

9 Woe to him that coveteth an evil covetousness to his house, that he may set his nest on high, that he may be delivered from the power of evil!

10 Thou hast consulted shame to thy house by cutting off many people, and hast sinned against thy soul.

11 For the stone shall cry out of the wall, and the beam out of the timber shall answer it.

12 Woe to him that buildeth a town with blood, and stablisheth a city by iniquity!

13 Behold, is it not of the LORD of hosts that the people shall labour in the very fire, and the people shall weary themselves for very vanity?

14 For the earth shall be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD, as the waters cover the sea.

c. Don't Wonder (try to dull the fear with substances) – It will destroy you (Habakkuk 2:5,15-17)

15 Woe unto him that giveth his neighbour drink, that putteth thy bottle to him, and maketh him drunken also, that thou mayest look on their nakedness!

16 Thou art filled with shame for glory: drink thou also, and let thy foreskin be uncovered: the cup of the LORD'S right hand shall be turned unto thee, and shameful spewing shall be on thy glory.

17 For the violence of Lebanon shall cover thee, and the spoil of beasts, which made them afraid, because of men's blood, and for the violence of the land, of the city, and of all that dwell therein.

d. Don't Worship Idols – It will make you dumb! (Habakkuk 2:18-19)

18 What profiteth the graven image that the maker thereof hath graven it; the molten image, and a teacher of lies, that the maker of his work trusteth therein, to make dumb idols?

19 Woe unto him that saith to the wood, Awake; to the dumb stone, Arise, it shall teach! Behold, it is laid over with gold and silver, and there is no breath at all in the midst of it.

e. Don't Worry - God's In Charge! (Habakkuk 2:20)

20 But the LORD is in his holy temple: let all the earth keep silence before him.
