Zephaniah

Key Verse:

Zephaniah 2:3 Seek ye the Lord, all ye **meek** of the earth, which have wrought his judgment; seek righteousness, seek meekness: it may be ye shall be hid in the day of the Lord's anger.

Meekness is not weakness! Meekness is the removal of self from the equation.

Introduction to Zephaniah

- Zephaniah identifies himself better than any of the other Minor Prophets.
- He traced his lineage back to his great-great-grandfather, Hizkiah (whom we know as Hezekiah), king of Judah.
- Zephaniah was of the **royal** line.
- The days of Josiah the son of Amon, king of Judah (Zephaniah 1:1)
- Zephaniah was the last of the prophets before the **Captivity**.
- He was contemporary with Jeremiah
- He is credited with helping to **start** the revival during the reign of Josiah.
- The same theme as the Gospel of **John**
- John is called the apostle of **love**
- Zephaniah is the prophet of **love** through punishment

Love often leads to discipline through punishment

Zephaniah 3:17 The LORD thy God **in the midst of thee is mighty**; he will **save**, he will **rejoice** over thee with joy; **he will rest** in his love, **he will joy** over thee with singing.

Zephaniah 3:1 Woe to her that is filthy and polluted, to the oppressing city!

• The Book of Zephaniah is filled with the wrath and judgment of God, but there is the undertone of the love of God

The Term "Jealousy" occurs twice in this book.

Zephaniah 1:18 Neither their silver nor their gold shall be able to deliver them in the day of the Lord's wrath; but the whole land shall be devoured by the fire of his jealousy: for he shall make even a speedy riddance of all them that dwell in the land.

Zephaniah 3:8 Therefore **wait ye upon me**, saith the Lord, until the day that I rise up to the prey: for my determination is to gather the nations, that I may assemble the kingdoms, to pour upon them mine indignation, even all my fierce anger: for all the earth shall be devoured with the fire of my jealousy.

- God is jealous of the love those who are His.
- He is jealous for the love of mankind.
- His jealousy is for the affection of His people
