- 39 Then hear thou in heaven thy dwelling place, and forgive, and do, and give to every man according to his ways, whose heart thou knowest; (for thou, even thou only, knowest the hearts of all the children of men;)
- 40 That they may **fear thee** all the days that they live in the land which thou gavest unto our fathers.
