#### II. The Prophecy – God's Great Army (Joel 1:4 – 2:17) Joel 1:4

That which the **palmerworm** hath left hath the **locust** eaten; and that which the locust hath left hath the **cankerworm** eaten; and that which the cankerworm hath left hath the **caterpiller** eaten.

- A. The Work of a Destructive Famine (Joel 1:4)
  - 1. The Palmerworm (Moth larva) eat tree leaves responsible for deforestation
  - 2. The Locust (Swarming grasshopper) destroyer of leafy plants suddenly)
  - 3. The Cankerworm (Inchworms) eat all parts of the leaf
  - 4. Caterpillar the larval stage of butterflies and moths that eat all green foliage
- 1. **Palmer-worm** = (Heb. gazam). The English word may denote either a **caterpillar** which wanders like a palmer or pilgrim, or which travels like pilgrims in bands # Joe 1:4 2:25 the wingless locusts, or the **migratory locust in its larva state**.

## 2. Locust = There are ten Hebrew words used in Scripture to signify locust.

The name also occurs in # Re 9:3,7 in allusion to this Oriental devastating insect.

They are of many species. The ordinary Syrian locust resembles the grasshopper, but is larger and more destructive.

"The legs and thighs of these insects are so powerful that they can leap to a height of two hundred times the length of their bodies. When so raised they spread their wings and fly so close together as to appear like one compact moving mass."

The devastations they make in Eastern lands are often very appalling. The invasions of locusts are the heaviest calamities that can befall a country. "Their numbers exceed computation: the hebrews called them 'the countless,' and the Arabs knew them as 'the darkeners of the sun.' Unable to guide their own flight, though capable of crossing large spaces, they are at the mercy of the wind, which bears them as blind instruments of Providence to the doomed region given over to them for the time. Innumerable as the drops of water or the sands of the seashore, their flight obscures the sun and casts a thick shadow on the earth DESTROYER OF BROAD LEAFED PLANTS - most farm crops

3. **Cankerworm** = (Heb. yelek), "the licking locust," which licks up the grass of the field; probably the locust at a certain stage of its growth, just as it emerges from the caterpillar state # Joe 1:4 2:25 The word is rendered "caterpillar" in # Ps 105:34 Jer 51:14-17 (but R.V. "cankerworm"). "It spoileth and fleeth away" # Na 3:16 or as some read the passage, "The cankerworm

putteth off [i.e., the envelope of its wings], and fleeth away." They live Underground for 13-17 years

- B. The Wake of a Destructive Famine (Joel 1:5-1:12)
- 1. Wake, Weep, Wail all Drunkards (pleasure seekers) (Joel 1:5)

Joel 1:5-7
5 Awake, ye drunkards, and weep; and howl, all ye drinkers of wine, because of the new wine; for it is cut off from your mouth.

#### a. The Enemy has attacked

6 For a nation is come up upon my land, strong, and without number, whose teeth are the teeth of a lion, and he hath the cheek teeth of a great lion.

### b. They have destroyed the Land

7 He hath laid my vine waste, and barked my fig tree: he hath made it clean bare, and cast it away; the branches thereof are made white.

## c. How destruction occurred – We were asleep from our drunkenness Webster's 1828

drunkards = *noun* One given to ebriety or an excessive use of strong liquor; a person who habitually or frequently is drunk.

"A drunkard and a glutton shall come to poverty." Proverbs 23:21.

"The nation's under attack but no one seems to care because they feel relaxed!"

- 2. Households will be destroyed (Joel 1:8)
- 8 Lament like a virgin girded with sackcloth for the husband of her youth.
  - 3. The Lord's house is in famine also (no nourishment) (Joel 1:9)
- 9 The **meat offering and the drink offering is cut off** from the house of the LORD; the priests, the LORD'S ministers, mourn.
  - 4. The food industry is destroyed (Joel 1:10-12)

- 10 The field is wasted, the land mourneth; for the corn is wasted: the new wine is dried up, the oil languisheth.
- 11 Be ye ashamed, O ye husbandmen(a worker of the land not an owner); howl, O ye vinedressers(worker of the vines), for the wheat and for the barley; because the harvest(reaping of the crop) of the field is perished.
- 12 The vine is dried up, and the fig tree languisheth; the pomegranate tree, the palm tree also, and the apple tree, even all the trees of the field, are withered: because joy is withered away from the sons of men.

#### **Matthew 9:36-38**

- 36 But when he saw the multitudes, he was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted, and were scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd.
- 37 Then saith he unto his disciples, The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few:
- 38 Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest.
