# The Book of I Timothy – Paul's Helper

## I. Who was Timothy?—

- Timothy was a young man from Lystra.
- Acts 16:1-2 says Timothy was a disciple.
- He was saved during Paul's first visit to Lystra in Acts 14:8-20
- Whose father was a Greek
- His mother was **Eunice** was a Jewess
- Paul referred to both Eunice and his grandmother Lois as women of "unfeigned faith."
- Paul referred to Timothy as his "own son in the faith" in I Timothy 1:2
- Paul also called him his "dearly beloved son" in II Timothy 1:2
- In the book of Timothy, Paul is writing to this young man who is now the pastor of the church at Ephesus (I Timothy 1:3)
- In Acts 16:1-2, Timothy was a disciple
- Timothy's name means *dear* or *precious* to God.

II. Timothy's Dedication—Acts 16:1-3 tells us something about this man, Timothy.

**First**, he was called a "disciple", meaning *learner*. Paul realized that this young man was very valuable because he was *teachable*.

Second, we find that he was "well reported of by the brethren." In other words, he had a good **testimony** with the men of the church.

Thirdly, Timothy was circumcised.

**III. Timothy worked the work**—In **I Corinthians 16:10** Paul tells us that Timothy **"worketh the work of the Lord."** 

**IV. Timothy was a minister of God**—In I Thessalonians 3:2

Quick Layout of Timothy's Ministry that we know of:

- When Paul went on to Athens, Silas and Timothy stayed for some time at Beroea and Thessalonica before joining Paul at Corinth.
- Timothy next appears in Acts during Paul's stay in Ephesus (54-57),
- In late 56 or early 57 Paul sent him forth to Macedonia with the aim that he would eventually arrive at Corinth.
- Timothy arrived at Corinth just after 1 Corinthians reached that city.
- The letter was not well received, and Timothy quickly returned to Ephesus to report this to Paul.
- Timothy was with Paul in Corinth during the winter of 57-58 when Paul dispatched his Letter to the Romans. (Romans 16:21)
- According to Acts 20:3-6, Timothy was with Paul in Macedonia just before Passover 58;

- He left the city before Paul, going ahead of him to await Paul in Troas. (Acts 20:4-5)
- It's believed that In the year 64, Paul left Timothy at Ephesus, to govern that church.
- His relationship with Paul was close.
- Paul entrusted him with missions of great importance.
- Timothy's name appears as the co-author on II Corinthians, Philippians, Colossians, I Thessalonians, II Thessalonians and Philemon.
- Paul wrote to the Philippians about Timothy, "I have no one like him." (Philippians 2:19-23)
- When Paul was in prison and awaiting martyrdom, he summoned his faithful friend for a last farewell.<sup>[9]</sup>
- Timothy was jailed at least once during the period of the writing of the New Testament is implied by the writer of Hebrews mentioning Timothy's release at the end of the epistle.
