Introduction to Philemon

- Philemon is a **personal** letter from Paul to his friend
- Onesimus was a slave of a believer named Philemon in Colossae.
- Apparently Onesimus had stolen from Philemon and fled.
- At some time while Paul was under arrest, Onesimus met Paul
- Onesimus became a Christian
- Paul apparently wrote this letter at the same time as Colossians and gave it to Onesimus to carry back to Philemon

Colossians 4:9 With Onesimus, a faithful and beloved brother, who is *one* of you. They shall make known unto you all things which *are done* here.

- Paul **appealed** to Philemon to take Onesimus back into his household
- Now as a **brother in the Lord** rather than a slave.
- In Paul's estimation, Onesimus was far more "useful" now that he was a Christian.
- Paul even promised to **pay** whatever **debt** Onesimus might owe Philemon.

The City of Colossae: The city was located about 75-100 miles east of Ephesus in Asia Minor (modern day Turkey).

Key Verses – Philemon 1:10-11

10 I beseech thee for my son **Onesimus(profitable or useful)**, whom I have begotten in my bonds:

I. Paul's Presentation (I'm a prisoner like Onesimus is – and so are you) (Philemon 1:1-8)

A. Fellow Laborer (We have worked together) (Philemon 1:1b)

B. Fellow Soldier (We have fought together) (Philemon 1:2)

C. Fellow **Prayer** (We have Prayed together) (Philemon 1:3-4)

D. Fellow **Preacher** (We preach together the same message!) (Philemon 1:5)

1. Faith and Love (Philemon 1:5)(Proper combination)

2. Faith Communicator (Philemon 1:6) (Preacher)

3. Faith Encourager (Philemon 1:7-8)(Refresher of the brethren)

7 For we have great joy and consolation(paraklesis - *par-ak'-lay-sis* importation, supplication, entreaty exhortation, admonition, encouragement, consolation, solace; that which gives comfort or refreshment) in thy love, because the bowels of the saints are refreshed(to give rest, refresh) by thee, brother. 8 Wherefore, though I might be much **bold in Christ** to enjoin thee that which is convenient,

II. Paul's Plea (Philemon 1:9-19)

A. For Love's Sake I'm a begging prisoner (Philemon 1:9)

9 Yet for love's sake I rather beseech(beg)*thee*, being such an one as Paul the aged, and now also a prisoner of Jesus Christ.

B. For Love's Sake I'm begging you to give a second chance (Philemon 1:10-15) 10 I beseech(beg) thee for my son Onesimus(profitable or useful), whom I have begotten in my bonds:

11 Which in time past was to thee **unprofitable**(**useless**), but now **profitable**(**useful**) to thee and to me:

12 Whom I have sent again: thou therefore receive him, that is, mine own bowels:

13 Whom I would have retained with me, that in thy stead he might have ministered unto me in the bonds of the gospel:

14 But without thy **mind** (**opinion**) would I do nothing; that thy benefit should not be as it were of **necessity**(force), but willingly.

15 For perhaps **he therefore departed**(separated from) for a season, that thou shouldest receive him for ever;

1. As a friend (Philemon 1:16-17)

2. As without Debt – Debt Free! (Philemon 1:18)

3. As one you owe (You owe me!) (Philemon 1:19)
