Malachi 2:10-17 A. Judah's Infraction 1. God's Argument a. One Father - Abraham 10 Have we not all one father?

b. One God The Creator hath not **one God** created us?

2. God's Admonishment - Quit Treating each other poorly

why do we **deal treacherously(deceitfully, unfaithful)** every man against his brother, by **profaning(prostitute or pollute)** the **covenant(compact)** of our **fathers**?

3. God's Analysis - The Cause - Idolatry

11 Judah hath dealt treacherously, and an abomination(something disgusting, idolatry) is committed in Israel and in Jerusalem; for Judah hath profaned the holiness(sacred place) of the LORD which he loved, and hath married the daughter of a strange god.

B. Judah's Infliction - Punishment

1. Cut Off

12 The LORD will cut off the man that doeth this,

2. No Matter position

a. <mark>Government</mark> Leaders

the master

b. Educators

and the scholar, out of the tabernacles of Jacob,

c. Religious Leaders

and him that offereth an offering unto the LORD of hosts.

3. Your Offerings won't count

13 And this have ye done again, covering the altar of the LORD with tears, with weeping, and with crying out, insomuch that **he regardeth not the offering any more**, or receiveth it with good will at your hand.

C. Judah's Imminent Demise (God's illustration - a Bad Marriage)

1. You Promised

14 Yet ye say, Wherefore? Because the LORD hath been witness between thee and the wife of thy youth, against whom thou hast dealt treacherously: yet is she thy companion, and the wife of thy covenant.

15 And did not he make one? Yet had he the **residue(remnant)** of the spirit. And wherefore one? That he might **seek a godly seed**. Therefore take heed to your spirit, and **let none deal treacherously against the wife** of his youth.

2. You put her away because you spoke evil

16 For the LORD, the God of Israel, saith that **he hateth putting away**: for one covereth violence with his garment, saith the LORD of hosts: therefore take heed to your spirit, **that ye deal not treacherously**.

3. You persistently justified bad behavior

17 Ye have **wearied**(**exhausted**) **the LORD with your words**. Yet ye say, Wherein have we wearied him? When ye say, <u>Every one that doeth evil is good</u> in the sight of the LORD, and he delighteth in them; or, **Where is the God of judgment**?
