

## Proverbs 7:1-27

### Look **into my eye**

1 My son, keep my words, and lay up(**hind; hoard**) my commandments with thee.

2 Keep(**hedge about**) my commandments, and live; and my law as **the apple(pupil)** of thine eye.

3 Bind(**tie them**) them upon thy fingers, write them upon the table of **thine heart**.

### Add **wisdom** to that

4 Say unto wisdom, Thou *art* my sister; and call understanding *thy* kinswoman:

5 That they may keep thee from the strange woman, from the stranger *which* flattereth with her words.

### The Battle is for the simple mind(**the uncomplicated one**)

6 For at the window of my house I looked through my casement,

7 And beheld among **the simple ones**, I discerned among **the youths**, a **young man VOID OF UNDERSTANDING**,

### Leaving the protection of **the Instructor**

8 Passing through the street near **her corner**; and he went the way to her house,

#### Proverbs 5:3

3 For the lips of a **strange woman(an adultress)** drop *as* an honeycomb, and her mouth *is* smoother than oil:

### Be **careful** at night!

9 In the twilight, in the evening, **in the black and dark night**:

10 And, behold, **there met him a woman with the attire of an harlot**, and subtil(**sneaky**) of heart.

### She's **a talker**

11 (She *is* loud and stubborn;

### She's a **wanderer**

her feet **abide not in her house**:

12 Now *is she* without, now in the streets, and lieth in wait at every corner.)

### She's After **the simple**

13 So she **caught(seized)** him, and **kissed** him, *and* with an **impudent(hardened)** face said unto him,

Her **Lying** words

I'm **religious**

14 *I have* peace offerings with me; this day have I payed my vows.

I've been **looking** for you

15 Therefore came I forth to meet thee, diligently to seek thy face, and **I have found thee**.

The **Proposal**

16 I have decked my bed with coverings of tapestry, with carved *works*, with fine linen of Egypt.

17 I have perfumed my bed with myrrh, aloes, and cinnamon.

18 **Come**, let us take our fill of love until the morning: let us solace ourselves with loves.

My husband **isn't home**

19 For the **goodman** *is* not at home, he **is gone a long journey**:

20 He hath taken a bag of money with him, *and* will come home at the day appointed.

The **Catch**

21 With her much **fair speech**(**words of a teacher**) she caused him to yield(**to bend away**), with **the flattering**(**smoothness**) of her lips she forced(**to push**) him.

22 He goeth after her **straightway**(**instantly**), as an ox goeth to the **slaughter**(**butcher**), or as a **fool**(**the pervert**) to the **correction**(**chastisement**) of the stocks(**anklet; bondage**);

The **Cost**

23 Till a dart strike through his liver; as **a bird hasteth to the snare**, and **knoweth not** that it *is* for his life.

Please **Listen**

24 **Hearken** unto me now therefore, **O ye children**, and **attend**(**listen**) to the words of my mouth.

25 Let not thine heart **decline**(**deviate**) to **HER WAYS**, go not astray **IN HER PATHS**.

26 For **she hath cast down many wounded**: yea, **MANY STRONG MEN** have been slain by her.

27 Her **house** *is* the way to **HELL**, going down to the chambers of **DEATH**.
