3- correct their error by providing a response to the dearest wish of the Togolese in this year 2025, by purely and simply asking the dictator Faure Gnassingbé, heir to the villainous assassination of the father of Togo's independence, to leave power without bloodshed at the end of his current illegitimate mandate which ends in May 2025.

Furthermore, I urge you to consider taking actions that would help to heal the historical wounds and foster goodwill between the United States and Togo. This could include formally acknowledging any involvement, supporting educational initiatives in Togo, or promoting cultural and economic cooperation between our two nations.

Such steps would honor President Olympio's memory and strengthen the bonds of friendship and mutual respect between the United States and Togo. Your leadership would

be a powerful testament to the United States' dedication to human rights, justice, and international solidarity.
