- **1.** Meeting Called to Order: President Jim E. called the meeting to order at 11:35 a.m.
- **2. Approve the Agenda:** Motion to approve the agenda made by Dale and seconded by Ric. Motion approved.
- **3. Devotions:** Given by Jim T. from the Elders. (Parish Ed. in April)
- **4. Opening Prayer:** Given by Pastor Paul.
- **5. Approve Minutes of Last Meeting:** The February 13, 2022 Church Council Minutes, also previously emailed, were read by council members. Motion to approve the February 13, 2022 meeting minutes made by Nathan and seconded by Dale. Motion approved.

Treasurer Notes - February

- \$531.53 was transferred from the Contingency Fund to cover the intern housing expense for February.
- The \$15,000 special donation was transferred from the Contingency Fund to cover the cost of the carpet in the sanctuary.
- \$2,298.61 was transferred from the Memorial Fund to cover the remaining cost of carpet in the sanctuary.
- \$1000.00 was transferred from the Youth Savings to the Youth Checking to cover expenses.
- A special donation of \$20,000 was given this month to be used for the parking lot project. This amount is reflected in the Contingency Fund.

• The \$2,590 in the Clearing Account is Seed Offering from the Special Prayer Service led by for Intern Philip Sandi.

7. Board Reports:

- <u>Deacons</u> given by Ric. Present was Ric.
 - There were 4 Sundays in January. The attendance for the 8:00 a.m. service had an average of 25 and the 10:00 a.m. service an average of 86 for a total average of 111 per Sunday.
- <u>Elders</u> Given by Merlin. Present were Jim T., Pastor Paul, and Merlin.
- The assisting Elder Communion Schedule for Holy Week and April was set.
- The Prayer Room dedication is tentatively set for March 27.
- Parish Education Given by Sara Present were Sara and Robin.
 - A new date for Confirmation will be May 8 since only Jess Hendricks is being confirmed and the family had a conflict on May 1.
 - Still talking about having a Fun Night for the Youth. It will now be for grades $PreK 6^{th}$ grade. It will have 2 different age group activities as there are many younger children.
 - Still working on getting new furniture for the younger children. Megan has put together information about measurements and prices that they will plan to make a decision on.
- <u>Trustees</u> Given by Dale. Present were Nathan, Shawn, and Dale.
 - Dale commented he was present at the Trustee meeting for February, but his name was missing.
 - Tiffany Thomas has been hired to take Lonnie Gillen's place assisting the treasurer. Her background is in bookkeeping.
 - Getting ready to proceed with the parking lot. Asking for an abandonment of the alley as we will concrete the entire alley from Empire Street to the west end of the church. The Veterans Building members will be contacted.
 - The front steps will need some work again as people are using salt which damages the brick.
 - Looking into the drinking fountain downstairs so children are able use it without assistance.
 - The new covers on the kneeling pads that coordinate with the new carpet are done and in place.
 - Looking into repairing the flagpole for the Christian flag.
 - Will be power washing and cleaning the building bricks.
 - Dale reported he contacted Owens about the electrical problem in Val's office and it is fixed.

8. Pastor's Report: Given by Pastor Paul.
