From the Pastor's Desk

“What are Your Plans for Y2026?” (January)

HAPPY NEW YEAR!!

- 1. Meeting Called to Order:** President Nate Thompson called the meeting to order.
- 2. Approve the Agenda:** Motion to approve the agenda made by Dale and seconded by Matt. Motion approved.
- 3. Opening Prayer:** Given by Pastor Marc.
- 4. Devotions:** Given by Pastor Marc.
- 5. Approve Minutes of Last Meeting:** The November 9, 2025 Church Council meeting minutes previously emailed, were read by council members. Motion to approve the November 9, 2025 Church

Council meeting minutes made by Dale and seconded by Al.
Motions approved.

6. Treasurer's Report: Given by Tiffany. Copies of the November Financial Report are available on the bulletin board near the office and on the table in a yellow/orange folder by the front door entrance.)

Treasurer's Notes – November

- The second half of Benevolence has been paid out for the remainder of the year.
- We are down \$55,000 in offerings total as of the end of November that was budgeted for the year 2025, however, expenses are down which will help a little.

7. Board Reports:

- **Deacons** – given by Mike. Present was Ric, Al, Mike.
 - There were 5 Sundays in November. The attendance for 8 a.m. services had an average of 16 and the 10 a.m. had an average of 64 for a total average of 80. The snow storm on November 30 caused our average numbers to be lower. We did not have an 8 a.m. service at all and only 17 members came to the 10 a.m. service which skewed the numbers.
 - The Deacons did shovel steps during November.
- **Elders** – given by Jeanne. Present were Andy, Marilyn, President Nate, Vice President Ryan, and Jeanne.
 - Jeanne opened with prayer.
 - Met with President Nate and Vice President Ryan.
 - Discussed December and a little of January elder assisting communion worship schedules.
 - Discussed Worship Committee, Music Committee, and Mutual Ministry Committee responsibilities according to the Constitution.
 - Discussed the length of the service and is under consideration.

- **Parish Ed.** – Given by Megan. Present were Kati, Megan, and Robin.
 - Working on the Children's Christmas Program which will be on December 21 at the 10 a.m. service only.
 - We went Christmas caroling on Wednesday, December 10 at Riki Timbrook and Hillis and Glenda Rockey's homes.
 - Ordered the curriculum for January.
- **Trustees** – Given by Dale. Present were Nathan, Dale, and Matt.
 - We will have a possible \$3000 bill for the repair of the boilers.
 - The church's internet and WIFI are running well and is now locked down. Our new devise allows us to see any devise connected to it, and any website they go to. We believe someone near our church had access to our open guest network and WIFI and it had some inappropriate things show up, but this devise has now been blocked. We have also limited the hours that our guest network is available, so between 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. our guest network disappears and no one can have access. The network inside to the church is still available for us to use.
 - Discussion for snow emergency issues will be taken up in New Business.
 - Feel that a general offering should be collected during the Christmas Eve service and not just put out baskets at each door as offering giving is down.

8. Pastor's Report: Given by Pastor Marc.

- This month had many things happening. We celebrated 1st communion on November 9.
- We had a Baptism on November 2 which was actually scheduled for October before, but had to be changed at a request of the family.
- We also had Harvest Fest Sunday and a Congregational meeting and with all these special things happening during November it was hard to control the length of the service.

- I was involved with the planning of the Montpelier Community Thanksgiving service.
- We are in the midst of the Advent services.
- The North West Ohio Mission District group of pastors met here and the Ladies of the WOTC prepared a delicious breakfast and lunch for them.
- We had planned on a youth pizza night with the youth from Trinity Lutheran in Delta, but sadly did not happen. We were not able to get our kids to commit to going there as they were busy with other things, so am looking for a future date and time that might be workable with our youth.
- Have had hospital visits and home visits, meetings, at home communion, 2 movie nights with a discussion afterwards.
- Last we had a Zoom meeting with the Ohio District Camp Board, which is a newly formed board to look at doing something with camps in Ohio in the future. Discussion is now about looking to have a family camp in 2026, but working on what goals are achieved on doing it.

9. Other Report:

10. Approve All Reports: Motion to approve all reports made by Andy and seconded by Ryan. Motion approved.

12. Old Business:

- Matt spoke that there are plenty of candles that his Adult Sunday School class can work with to prepare them for Christmas Eve.

13. New Business:

- President Nate asked about when the Installation of church Council Officers could be done and it was decided to have on Sunday, January 11, 2026.

- Discussion about the new tri-fold updated church brochure and where they can be distributed. We will look into printing that in January.
- Ryan asked about Harvest Fest offerings. Tiffany stated there is about \$4200 that has come in so far. There was much discussion about options and ideas. Motion made by Nathan and seconded by Megan to give \$500 for each LifeWise school organization at Montpelier, North Central, Edon, and West Unity from the Harvest Fest offerings. Motion approved.
- Much more discussion was had about the church cancellation policy. President Nate suggested that if it's a level 3 at 10 p.m. Saturday night, church will be cancelled. Pastor Marc and Nathan offered to still come and have an online service available to watch for those who cannot come. All agreed we need a policy so President Nate will write up a policy and present it to council.
- Ryan stated we need to set up a congregational meeting. January 25 was agreed on. Jeanne wants to have all board reports in by January 19.
- A big thank you to Ric and Nate who are going off council this year.

14. Adjournment: Motion to adjourn the meeting made by Ryan and seconded by Dale. Motion approved.

15. Lord's Prayer: The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer. Next meeting is Jan. 11, 2026 at 11:30 a.m.
