

- **1.** Meeting Called to Order: President Jim E. called the meeting to order at 11:35 a.m.
- **2. Approve the Agenda:** Motion to approve the agenda made by Bill and seconded by Mike Motion approved.
- **3. Devotions:** Given by Bill from the Trustees. (Deacons in June)
- **4. Opening Prayer:** Given by Pastor Paul.
- 5. Approve Minutes of Last Meeting: The April 10, 2022 Church Council Minutes, also previously emailed, were read by council members. Motion to approve April 10, 2022 meeting minutes made by Dale and seconded by Merlin. Motion approved.
- **6. Treasurer's Report:** (Copies of the April Financial Report are available on the bulletin board near the office and on the table in a yellow/orange folder by the front entrance.)

Treasurer Notes – April

- \$1,303.99 was transferred from the Memorial Fund to cover the cost of covering the kneelers and \$2,910 was transferred to cover the cost of the Prayer Room.
- The Clearing Account consists of the Seed Offering of \$2,590 from the Special Prayer Service offered by Philip Sandi and \$630 collected to pay for the Easter Flowers.
- Lonnie Gillen introduced Tiffany Thomas to Council members as the new Assistant Treasurer as Lonnie will no longer continue in that position.
- President Jim E. commented we are a little behind in our budget in the area of revenue.

7. Board Reports:

• <u>Deacons</u> – given by Mike. Present was Ric and Mike.

- There were 4 Sundays in April. The attendance for the 8:00 a.m. service had an average of 26 and the 10:00 a.m. service an average of 96 for a total average of 122 per Sunday. There was 1 Lent Wednesday service in April with 36 attending. Maundy Thursday attendance was 36 with 22 sharing a meal together and on Good Friday was 21people came. Attendance for the Easter Sunrise service was 40, at the 8 a.m. it was 23 and the 10 a.m. service had 113.
- <u>Elders</u> Given by Merlin. Present were Pastor Paul, Jeanne, and Merlin.
 - The assisting Elder Communion Schedule for June is set.
 - Discussed visiting select members.
 - Discussed that Pastor Paul was installed at St. John's on June 19, 2011. A note will be in the bulletin that Sunday to acknowledge his installation anniversary.
- <u>Parish Education</u> Given by Megan. Present were Megan, Sara, and Robin.
- May 22 will be our last Sunday School until September.
- Teacher and Graduation Recognition will be Sunday, May 29 and all the gifts are ordered for those.
- Vacation Bible school (VBS) will be June 20 24. Paper registrations are available at the Montpelier Library and also in the church office. Megan will be meeting with all the leaders.
- Next fall, we will need a confirmation teacher on Sunday and looking for a volunteer.
 - <u>Trustees</u> Given by Dale Present were Nathan, Shawn, Bill, Dale and Matt Sloan.
 - Jeanne Willson submitted for vacation time to attend the Mission Trip to Birmingham, AL and the Trustees approved.
 - Dale said thank you to Nathan for fixing the upstairs Men's Rest Room toilet.

- A water fountain for downstairs has been ordered as the old one was very difficult for the children to use. Thank you to the person who donated the cost for it.
- Mike and Melinda Shilling have donated a new American flag.
- The building will be power washed in June when the weather is warmer.
- Trustees passed a motion to place 2 names for signing checks; adding Tiffany Thomas along with Valerie Steinke's name. They will need to sign a new card at the bank.
- Megan will also have to sign for the Youth Account for the bank requirement of the new signature card.
- The V. Richards Account fund will be moved from ELCA to a local account after waiting for the 6-year CD to come due.
- St. John's was given the okay to close the alley from Montpelier Village.

8. Pastor's Report: Given by Pastor Paul.

- o For the month of April worship services: 8 Sunday services, 5 seasonal services, 7 sermons, 2 funerals and 1 worship service at Evergreen and at Fountain Park. In person visits: 7 homes, nursing homes, hospital, 8 office or elsewhere. Attended 3 meetings and 11 other events. Taught 6 classes. Assorted other contacts telephone, Facebook, etc.
- Pastor Paul shared with Council that it is his plan to retire at
 the end of November of this year so he can spend more time
 with his family. He had promised the Elders he would give
 them 6 months' notice. President Jim E will be contacting our
 Northwest Ohio District Dean, Bert Schultz, who will help
 guide our congregation through this time with interims and call
 committees.

- Joy Gruetter has also submitted her retirement as the Children's Choir Director and the Senior Choir Director effective May 31, 2022. This will give the congregation time to plan for the music programs when they start up again in the fall.
- President Jim E. spoke that he will contact the Dean and then
 we will need to form a call committee of 6 voting members
 according to our Constitution. Next Sunday, he will make an
 announcement during both church services next Sunday and
 seek volunteers for the Call Committee.
- Members of Council spoke words of appreciation of Pastor Paul's leadership, especially as we were starting out with NALC.
- Pastor Paul reminded council that the Dean will work on interim coverage. He also reminded council that St. John's has assets of finances and many children's ministries that are attractive to pastors.
- **9. Reports:** There were no committee reports.
- **10. Approve All Reports:** Motion to approve all reports made by Dale and seconded by Shawn. Motion approved.
- **11. Half-Time Prayer:** Pastor Paul led the prayer.

12. Old Business:

- Megan related that she would like to order 10 short chairs with 4 tables and 10 taller chairs with 4 tables for the 2 downstairs classrooms that would cost \$5,011.60. Motion to approve the purchase of 20 chairs and 8 tables at a cost of \$5,011.60 made by Megan and seconded by Pastor Paul. Motion approved.
- There was discussion about using Philip Sandi's Special Prayer Service Seed Offering money to help pay for the furniture. Motion to approve the ordering of the furniture and to use the Contingency Fund to pay for it made by Nathan and seconded by Shawn. Motion approved.

13. New Business:

- Bill requested Council's approval to serve as Vice President and that his Trustee's position be filled by Matt Sloan.
- Motion to approve to move Bill Hill from Trustee to Vice President for the balance of this year made by Nathan and seconded by Shawn. Motion approved.
- Motion to approve Matt Sloan to fill the Trustee position left vacant by Bill Hill made by Shawn and seconded by Mike.
 Motion approved.
- Motion to move the V. Richards Memorial Account from ELCA to a local account made by Dale and seconded by Shawn. Motion approved.
- There was discussion about forming a Call Committee.
 Motion to approve the Elders to assemble a list of names on a Call Committee for Council's approval made by Nathan and seconded by Shawn. Motion approved.
- **14. Adjournment:** Motion to adjourn the meeting made by Shawn and seconded by Bill. Motion approved.
- **15.** Lord's Prayer: The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer. Next meeting is June 12 at 11:30 a.m.
