- **1.** Meeting Called to Order: President Michael called the meeting to order at 12:05 p.m.
- **2. Approve the Agenda:** Motion to approve the agenda made by Dale and seconded by Mike. Motion approved.
- **3. Devotions:** Given by Megan for Parish Ed. (Trustees in May)
- **<u>4. Opening Prayer:</u>** Given by Pastor George Zornow.
- 5. Approve Minutes of Last Meeting: The March 10, 2024 Church Council minutes, previously emailed out, were read by council members. Motion to approve the March 10, 2024 Church Council minutes with the typo of 12:04 a.m. corrected to p.m. on Meeting Called to Order, made by Mike and seconded by Dale. Motion approved.

Treasurer Notes - March:

- There was information and discussion about the CD renewals and updates will be given next month.
- Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report made by Matt and seconded by Ann. Motion approved.

7. Board Reports:

• <u>Deacons</u> – given by Mike. Present were Ric and Mike.

- There were 5 Sundays in March. The attendance for the 4 Sundays, minus Easter, for 8:00 a.m. services had an average of 20 and the 10:00 a.m. service an average of 69 with a total average of 89 per Sunday.
- The 3 Wednesday Lenten services averaged 35 in attendance.
- Maundy Thursday had 42 at the service and 16 at the potluck meal before it.
- Good Friday had 30 in attendance at the service.
- Easter Sunday, March 31 service had 37 at the 8 a.m. and 136 at the 10 a.m.
- There are issues with the sound board and Mike will come in this week to check on it.
- <u>Elders</u> Given by Ann. Present were Matthew, Ann, Marilyn, and Jeanne.
 - Jeanne opened with prayer.
 - Discussed the Elder Worship Schedule for May.
 - Will continue to contact members not attending and will meet again on April 23 at 1 p.m.
- Parish Ed.— Given by Megan. Present were Megan, Sara. Riki, and Robin.
 - An interview has been conducted for Confirmation. Briggs will be confirmed on May 5 at the 10 a.m. service.
 - The last Wednesday night activities and classes will be April 24 and the last Sunday School classes will be April 28. Confirmation classes are also done as they have gone through their book.
 - We will have Teacher Recognition on Sunday, April 28 and Graduation Recognition will be May 19.
- <u>Trustees</u> Given by Dale. Present were Nathan, Dale, Jason, and Matt.

- A church Work Day will be scheduled Saturday, May 11 at 8 a.m. Need help for pulling weeds, mulching, and some power washing.
- New windows for the east side should be coming this week and Siebenaler has been contacted to install them.
- The flag poles need to be replaced in the front of the church, possibly with taller ones. The Trustees are open to suggestions as to where they should be positioned.
- Unfortunately, the new concrete in the west parking lot is falling apart. Dale will contact the company about replacement as it is only 2 years old.

8. Pastor's Report:

- Pastor George Zornow apologized about not being able to be here on Palm Sunday due to his nose bleed problems.
- He was able to contact the people who didn't have family nearby during Holy Week before Easter.
- The confirmation class have finished their studies on the New Testament. He has enjoyed teaching the class and working with the students.
- He emphasized that even when confirmation classes are done and you have been confirmed, doesn't mean you are done with your faith. He wants students and parents to understand that confirmation isn't graduation, but a step into life 's journey of growing in your faith. He recommends adult members even take a Bible Study at least once a year to help their faith to grow.
- He added we should encourage young people to go into the ministry

9. Committee Reports:

Brenda Athy, president of WOTC and a member of the Call Committee gave reports.

- The WOTC Board has decided to move the kitchen cleaning to October.

 The board members are concerned that hardly any soap was collected for soap month in March. Pastor George added the NALC warehouses are depleted and need help replenishing supplies for NALC Disaster Response due to so many disasters lately.

The Call Committee will be talking to church members next week at both services.

- Megan spoke how we have been without a Music Director for several years and so she is looking to do something different on Wednesday, rather than the traditional ½ hour music class and ½ hour study class. She would like to have 15 minutes of worship and praise with all ages together and then break off into their classes.
- Megan asked if we have internet in the sanctuary so she could run videos from the back and play them in the front on the screen so only one person can run everything. Nathan replied we do have internet, but not Wi-Fi. Megan then asked about having a flat screen TV with ROKU or a Smart TV on a cart which would be helpful for one person to teach music only from the front especially for VBS this June. Nathan stated since we have concrete block walls, having Wi-Fi throughout the church would be a great undertaking. They will look into doing it just for the sanctuary as it would be difficult to do it in the classrooms. Discussions were also had about using a Hotspot on a cell phone for the classrooms. The Trustees gave

permission for Megan to buy a Smart TV with ROKU and a cart for under \$500.

- Dale shared that Matt would be moving the grass this year.

14.Adjournment: Motion to adjourn the meeting made by Mike and seconded by Megan. Motion approved.
