No Vehicles in the Park

Ten people live in the State of Amity (you can add as many zeros to that 10 to make it realistic if you like). Each person earns \$10,000. The people form a government having a legislature (all of them), a president, and a court. The legislature needs \$10,000 to pay for all the goods and services that they want it to perform. They vote to impose a tax of 10% on their income to raise this money. This means each of them will pay \$1,000 each.

One state legislator has proposed encouraging bike riding. The Legislature has hired you as a consultant to consider these issues.
