## So how can we help you on your horticultural journey?

The Colegrave Seabrook Foundation aims to encourage more people to consider horticulture as a career and support those you have done so and begun studying.

Once you have enrolled on your horticulture course you can apply for a scholarship from the Colegrave Seabrook Foundation.



## What course do I need to be doing to be eligible to apply for a scholarship?

You can be studying any type of horticulture or plant science related course at a registered college or university in the UK or Ireland.

This includes anything from apprenticeships to PhD courses.



### What sort of scholarships are available?

They include a number of student scholarships as well as scholarships specifically aimed at those students who wish to travel to broaden their horticultural knowledge.

Scholarship awards range from around £500 up to over £4,000



### Our scholarships

Your college tutor, or you as a student on a horticulture course, could apply for a Trip Bursary. If you feel that a group of you together with one or more of your tutors would benefit from visiting a grower or nursery, taking a trip to Kew Gardens or the Eden Project, or some other trip that would help increase your knowledge of horticulture or the plant world then this is the scholarship to apply for.



### How do I apply?

All applications should be made via our website, using the online form available with details about each scholarship.


