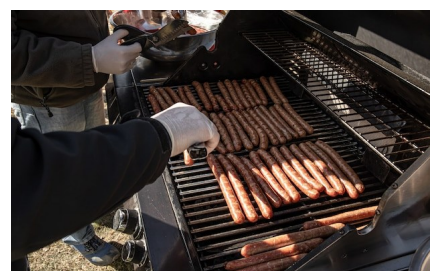

CURRA HALL COMMITTEE UPDATE

We've had some internal changes to the committee structure since our last newsletter. Laura Johns has assumed the role of Treasurer and will handle all financial aspects of the hall's activities. Craig Coleman will take on the role of interim Secretary in conjunction with his current position as President. This is expected to remain in place until we find a suitable person to take up the role of Secretary. Meanwhile Craig will become the first point of contact on matters relating to the hall.

In recent years the hall has increased its User Group activities, casual bookings and membership. A good indication that the hall is meeting the needs of the growing Curra community. Consequently, the workload for the committee has also increased. It was decided to purchase bookkeeping software and a hall hire booking app to streamline the day to day administration tasks.

The changes to the newsletter take effect with this edition. We have added extra pages and included new segments. We hope you will find this interesting and might even like to contribute ideas and articles that you think our readers would enjoy. Your contributions would add variety to the publication.

The Management Agreement between Gympie Regional Council and the Hall Committee has finally been renewed for a further 5 years following considerable negotiation.

For those who do not know the background to the hall's existence, the Curra Community Hall is the property of Gympie Regional Council and there is an agreement in place that authorizes the Hall Committee to manage the hall on behalf of the community. The terms of the Agreement set out the responsibilities of each party, like most contracts. The hall committee is responsible for managing the day to day affairs, is responsible for operation costs including insurance, electricity etc. and maintenance of the building and surrounds, except for major structural work, which remains the Council's responsibility as the owner.

The lengthy negotiations were necessary to counter the Council's desire to include additional responsibilities and costs in the new agreement that would have meant an increased burden on the Hall Committee in managing the ongoing activities.

With the many administrative matters the committee has had to address in the last 6 months we have not had time to host any community events. We plan to hold 1 or 2 events in the coming 6 months and to make them big affairs. One of which will be a mega Christmas Party with lots of things for family and kids. We realise that some people were disappointed there was no Christmas Party last year, but the Committee just did not have the energy to make it happen.

It may surprise you to know that we take 5-6 months of planning and work to put on a big event. So, please give your support to these when they come up.

We look forward to your involvement, attendance and enjoyment.

We would still like to see some people volunteer to assist with mowing our section of the grounds around the hall. At present we are having to pay a contractor and this is a drain on the hall's funds. Please contact Craig if you would like to hop on the ride on and do a lap.

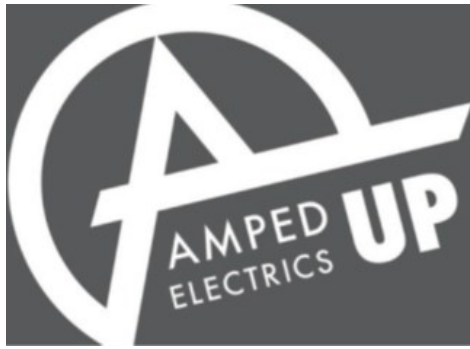

RECIPE CORNER

BURMA PRAWN CURRA

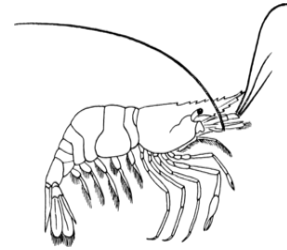
An easy recipe that is just a little bit different.

Ingredients :

- 2 teaspoons curry powder
- 500g prawns—heads, tails & shells removed.
- 2 tablespoons oil
- 2 large onions—finely sliced
- 2 cloves of garlic—finely sliced
- 1/2 to 1 cup of tomato juice

Method :

1. Heat oil, fry onions & garlic till they begin to brown.
2. Lower heat, add curry powder & 1 tbsp water, fry for few minutes.
3. Add tomato juice. Cover & simmer for 20 minutes.
4. Add prawns. When prawns are lightly cooked & heated through, serve with rice.

New Rules for Property Transactions from 1 July 2026

Australia's new anti-money laundering and counter-terrorism financing (AML/CTF) laws will take effect on 1 July 2026. These changes will fundamentally alter the home-selling process for property owners across Queensland.

Real estate is a prime target for financial crime, and these laws are necessary to stop criminals from using property to hide and legitimize illicit funds. Interestingly, 28% of all residential property purchases in Queensland are cash purchases and the Australian government's National Risk Assessment classifies the domestic real estate sector as a "very high" risk for money laundering.

Mandatory Identity Verification

Historically, listing a home required basic paperwork, however under the new requirements sellers (and buyers) must provide comprehensive identification and verification of beneficial ownership.

Real estate agents must actively assess financial risks and vet clients before providing services. This extra administrative layer means you can no longer rush a property onto the market overnight.

Enhanced Financial Scrutiny

Sellers must be prepared to answer questions regarding the source of their funds and property ownership history. For high-risk profiles or complex corporate trusts, agents will trigger Enhanced Customer Due Diligence (ECDD). Agencies are legally mandated to report any suspicious behaviour or unexplained wealth directly to the Australian Transaction Reports and Analysis Centre (AUSTRAC), and they are strictly prohibited from "tipping off" the client about the report.

Preparing For Your Sale

Sellers will have to verify their identity and establish their beneficial ownership before a real estate agent can list their property for sale. This is achieved through strict Verification of Identity (VOI) rules to prevent property fraud, and includes:

Providing a combination of primary and secondary categories of identification such as passports, birth certificates, drivers licenses and Medicare cards.

Face-to-Face Matching whereby a visual check is done to match your face to your photo identification.

Providing evidence to show a link between different names where a name discrepancy exists, i.e. married name / maiden name.

Sellers will have to prove they own the property and demonstrate the ownership structure. In simple cases, this will be achieved by providing a recent council rates notice or land title search. In more complex cases, such as a company, trust, or self-managed super fund, the seller will be required to provide information on all entities with ownership of 25% or more.

Sellers with a high-value property may be required to explain how they originally acquired the property, especially if it was a gift, inheritance, or purchased with foreign funds.

All sellers will also be required to show documentation linking their identity to the receiving bank account.

Your real estate agent and your conveyancer must *both* verify you independently. Do not be surprised when you are asked for the exact same ID documents twice during the transaction.

The Bigger Picture

Finally, AML/CTF rules go beyond real estate transactions and will affect you in other areas of your life. The rules also apply to legal professionals, accountants, trust and company service providers, dealers in precious stones and metals and, financial and digital asset services.

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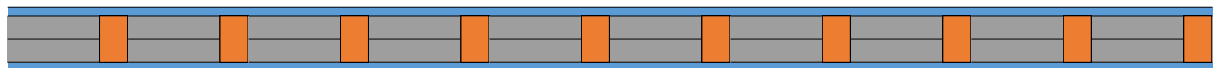

SKILLCENTRED HELPING AT THE HALL

Tony and his team of trainees from SkillCentred have been working at the hall recently to give the decks and stairs a fresh coat of decking oil. This is a job we must do each year as part of our maintenance obligations and without help from SkillCentred it would be very difficult for us to achieve.
