Once a bond has been set for an inmate, there are basically four ways that a person can be bonded from the jail.

- Property Bond Anyone owning property in Floyd County and are current on their property taxes can use that property to sign the bond. The maximum amount allowed on any property to sign a bond is 50% of the value of that property. If the inmate fails to appearin court, the property is seized.
- Cash Bond Anyone can pay the bond amount in cash. This money will be refunded when the inmate appears in court and the case is disposed of. If the inmate fails to ap-pear in court, the money is forfeited.
- Bondsman You may call one of the approved bonding companies to sign the bond. The bonding company will charge a fee for signature. (Only approved bonding compa¬nies are accepted)
- Transfer Bonds We accept out of county bonds. They must be approved by the sheriff's Office in that county. These bonds are placed in a sealed envelope and brought to the jail for processing.

You must bring a picture ID to the bonding lobby located at the rear of the jail in order to sign a bond.
