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The Problem

Cap on tuition fees for CSUs in 2012

Schools raised other fees and introduced new ones, such as the Student Success, Excellence, and Technology Fee (SSETF)

SSETF was made to improve the learning experience for students and have better retention and graduation rates for the school

The extra money doesn't go to the right places

Over 84% of the money from the SSETF went to athletics

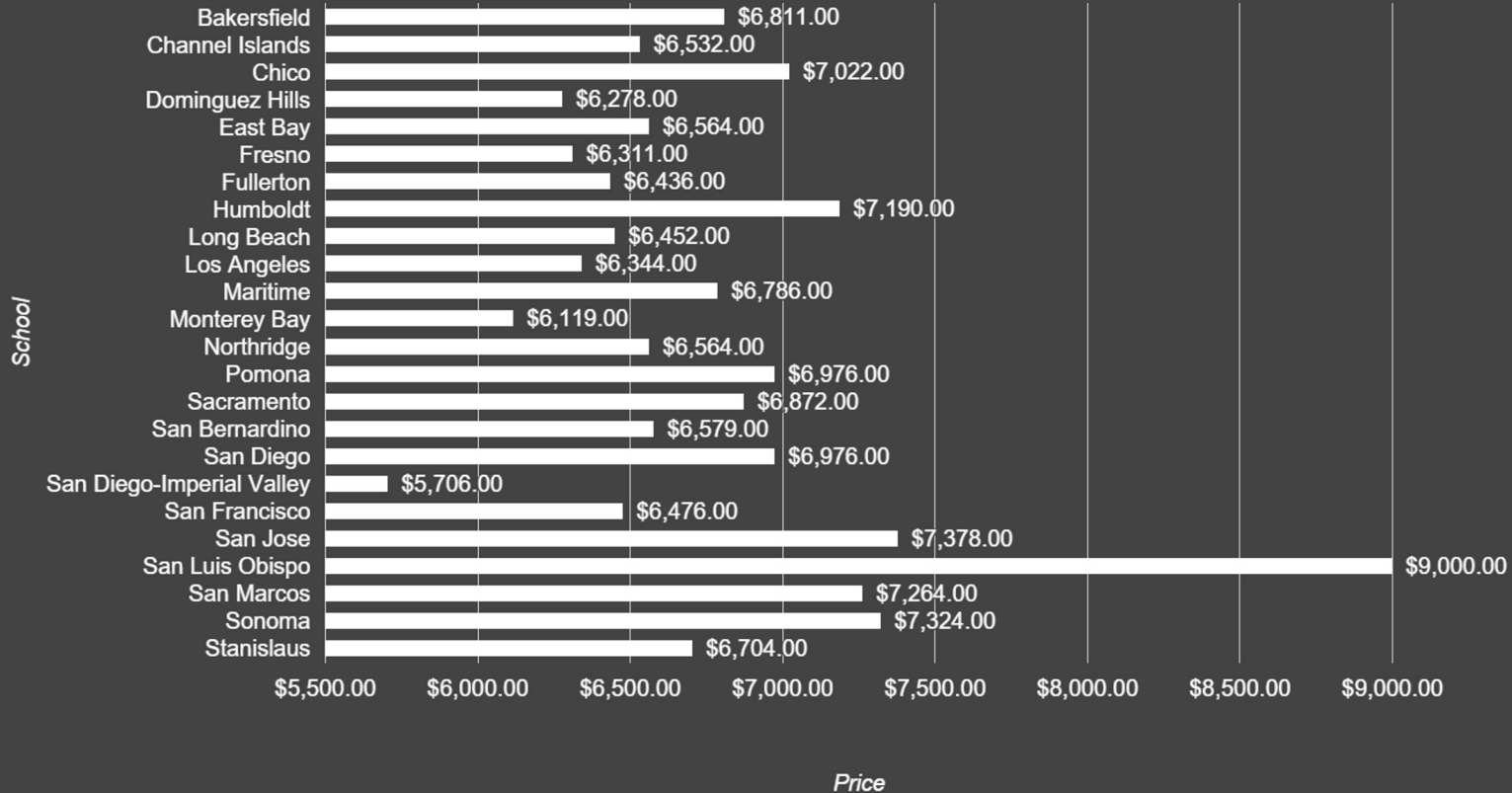
The Effect
