Southbury Women's Club's Operation Backpack 2025 to provide school supplies for children of Southbury families in need.

SOUTHBURY – With the last day of school barely behind us, *Southbury Women's Club's Operation Backpack* committee is already preparing for the new school year.

Working in close partnership with Southbury Social Services, Operation Backpack annually provides school supplies for the children of struggling Southbury families who have applied and qualified for assistance. A list is compiled of participating students, along with their school and grade, identified only by a family number in order to maintain confidentiality. School supply lists are collected from area schools, then shopping lists are created by cross referencing the two. The community is invited to help by purchasing items from an Amazon Wishlist. Committee members then purchase any remaining supplies, sort, label, assemble, and finally deliver backpacks and totes filled with all the supplies each child will need to begin their school year equipped similarly to their peers. Mary Silverman, Southbury Social Services Director shared, "One of the things I admire about the Women's Club is how much time and energy they invest in making sure the children are not identified as receiving assistance among their classmates...ensuring they are treated with dignity and respect. The look of joy on the children's faces and the relief on their parents (and/or guardians) {faces} at the distribution is truly telling of how crucial this program is to our community."

We extend special thanks to Connecticut Community Foundation and Midd-South Mustard Seed Fund for selecting Operation Backpack as a grant recipient. *Kathy Taylor, Esq., President and CEO of Connecticut Community Foundation commented, "Basic back to school supplies are a substantial and growing expense for so many local families — anywhere from \$80 to \$100 per year or more.
