About AFE and Arrow Global

AFE: AFE S.A. SICAV-RAIF ("AFE") invests in a diverse range of primarily non-performing debt and real estate assets across the UK and Europe. AFE has broad based expertise spanning unsecured and secured consumer, SME and corporate debt as well as real estate equity.

AFE was acquired by funds managed by Arrow Global Group Capital Management Limited ("AGGCM") in February 2024. AGGCM is the fund manager of Arrow Global ("Arrow"), a leading European alternative asset manager specialising in private credit and real estate. AFE now benefits from the wide network, extensive track record and expertise in origination, underwriting and asset management that Arrow Global has developed since inception.

Arrow: Founded in 2005 by Zach Lewy, CEO/CIO, Arrow delivers best-in-class risk-adjusted returns for global investors across European opportunistic credit, real estate lending and real estate equity. Arrow owns critical parts of the European infrastructure, giving an advantage when operating in fragmented European markets.

Arrow's asset management and servicing platforms manage approximately €95 billion of third-party AUM, underpinned by c. 2,000 talented professionals based locally across seven European geographies – with offices in London, Milan, Rome, Lisbon, Porto, Madrid, Amersfoort, Amsterdam, Düsseldorf, Luxembourg, Dublin, Manchester, Leeds, and Jersey, amongst others. This platform breadth and local expertise generates differentiated opportunities through disciplined investing, underwriting insight and proprietary deal flow. This vertically integrated advantage allows us to create sustainable value through market cycles.

Executive summary

Recent developments of AFE

- ► Arrow began managing AFE in February 2024 with Veld (formerly AnaCap) the Investment Advisor prior to this.
- Q4 2023: Veld closing forecast adjusted ERC down to €476m, giving 78% LTV.
 - for NPL assets, Arrow comfortable with updated NPL ERC.
 - for RE assets, third party valuers instructed per Arrow's standard procedures further €34m ERC adjustment made, giving proforma 85% LTV post adjustment.
- At restructuring, net debt increased by €39m given transaction costs and OID giving proforma 93% LTV at start of Arrow's tenure.
- ▶ Q1 2024: Post restructure, Arrow has successfully completed onboarding and focused on collecting ERC, optimising use of capital and investing in high multiple transactions.
 - Arrow started investing in Q1 with €23m of investments at blended 2.5x MOIC bringing LTV down to 90.7%.
 - Continuing focus on using Arrow's large origination footprint to deploy capital selectively into high multiple transactions.

2023 Year-End Financial Summary

2023 Financial Highlights

- Period managed by Veld Capital, prior to February 2024 recapitalisation.
- Cross Attributable Collections, €69m, driven by slow collections in Italy and Spain, plus delayed Real Estate collections
- Revenues, €47m, and Adjusted EBITDA, €40m, driven by reducing NPL portfolio size.
- ➤ 2023 asset impairments given:
 - several portfolios sold to generate liquidity prior to restructuring €7m impairment vs. book value at sale.
 - ERC reduced by €34m following year-end reforecasts €30m impairment to asset value.

Debt restructuring completed just after year-end, providing much needed liquidity

Successful Recapitalisation and Refinancing

- ► Feb 2024: 96% Bondholders consented to restructure and amendment, including maturity extended to July 2030.
- ► Under restructure, Arrow funds acquired majority ownership of AFE equity and AGGCM became Investment Advisor.
- Restructuring significantly improved liquidity of AFE, though increased overall Net Debt to €411m:
 - issuance of €36m bond principal at 70% price, generating
 €25m gross proceeds; and
 - increase of €37m in Super Senior Facility (SSF), replacing the prior RCF and covering €22m of transaction costs.

The restructuring resulted in a proforma increase in LTV to 93% due to increased Net Debt vs. cash

The recapitalisation overall led to higher Net Debt

- Net debt increased to €411m following recapitalisation in February 2024
 - €73m increase in SSF and bonds, while only generating €34m of cash post transaction costs.
- Based on a constant Q4 ERC level, this mechanically increases LTV from 78% to 86% post-restructure.
- Following external valuations post-recapitalisation, proforma LTV at point of recapitalisation (based on adjusted Q4 ERC and net debt) stands at 93%.
 - Q4 ERC adjusted by €35m based on third party valuer reviews.

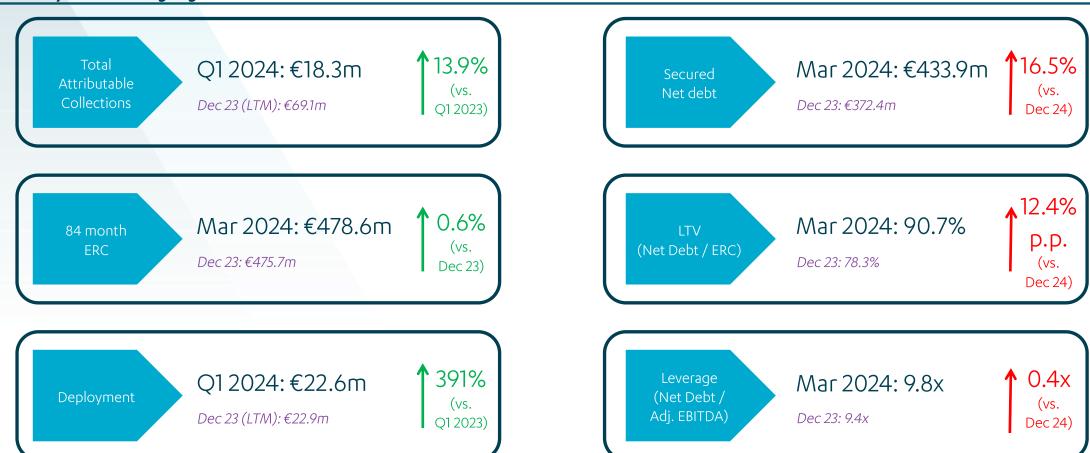

Q1 2024 Financial Highlights

- Gross Attributable Collections of €18m, above the equivalent 2023 period given strong NPL performance.
- ► Revenues, €9m, and Adjusted EBITDA, €11m.
 - large portion of EBITDA increase attributable to lower operating expenses vs. equivalent 2023 period.
- Liquidity improved significantly, €33m cash at the end of period.
- Net debt, €434m, increase primarily driven by added net debt from recapitalisation plus cash used for new investment.
- ▶ Q1 2024 asset impairments driven by review and revaluation of all portfolios by the AFE and Arrow team.
 - majority of impairment related to aligning real estate asset valuations to third party reviews (see next slide).

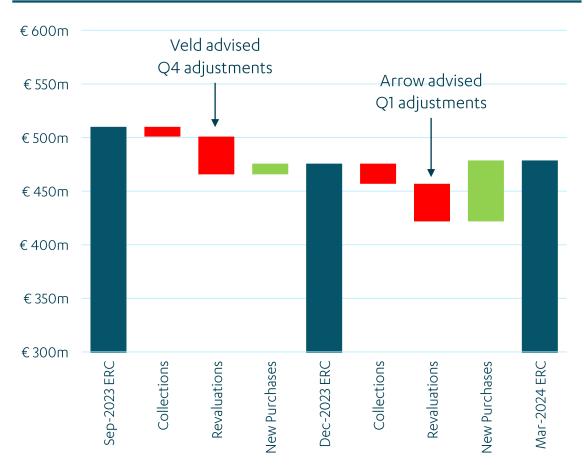

ERCs reviewed and adjusted, with new deployment balancing the impact of write downs

All assets were reviewed for the Q1 2024 accounts

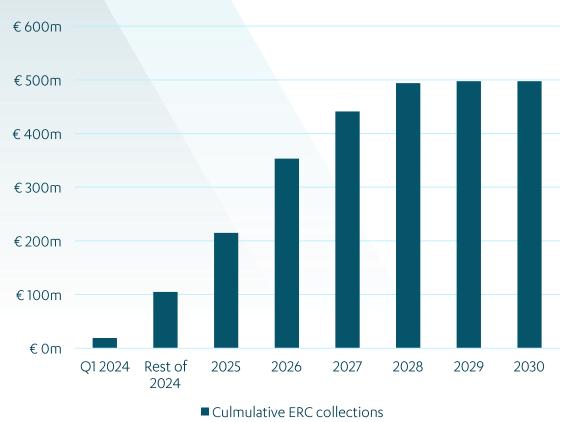
- ► In Q1 2024 all investments were revalued by AFE asset management team in conjunction with Arrow.
 - while some impairment loss on NPLs, mostly timing related with minimal adjustment to ERC.
 - following full review by Arrow, real estate investments' ERC reduced by €34m.
- To review real estate investments, third party valuations were instructed, in line with Arrow's standard ERC policies.
 - external valuations reflect significant weakening in legacy European office assets, with impact from widening exit cap rates and low liquidity.
- ► ERC reduction was partially offset by €57m of new investment ERC, primarily sourced from Arrow platforms.

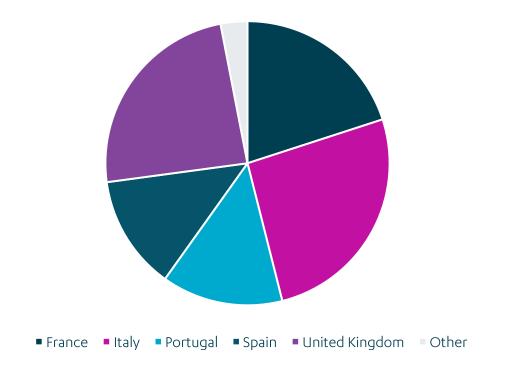
ERC development from Sep 2023 to Mar 2024

Arrow has successfully assumed management, and is focused on optimizing annual cash available for reinvestment going forward

Integration update

- ► Implementation of Arrow's standard governance and processes in Q1 as Investment Advisor.
- First investment leveraging off Arrow's platform completed in March 2024 for €17m.
- Successful onboarding of 20 AFE employees in UK, Italy, Luxembourg, Spain and Portugal into Arrow's systems and processes.
- Established relationship with all servicers and operating partners.
- ► Completion of full revaluation of assets by Arrow and AFE portfolio management team as of Q1 2024.
- Migration of IT and Finance infrastructure is advanced, with completion expected by end of June.

Adjusted Annual Run Rate metrics

- Over last 12 months significant non-BAU costs and impairments occurred, given financial liquidity constraints and ultimate restructuring.
- Investment Advisory management fees reduced vs. prior periods (1.5% management fee, instead of 1.75%).
- ► Removal of exceptional and non-recurring costs, consisting:
 - restructuring costs of €37m, including transaction costs, prior advisory fees, underwriting and consent fees.
 - asset impairment losses of €37m incurred in FY 2023, and €49m incurred in Q1 2024.
 - removal of Veld transitional expenses after Q2.
- ► Operation efficiency improvements via simplification of holding entities and reduce structure operating costs.
