From the Library Manager

As a lifelong library user, lover of libraries, and now a librarian that works in one five days a week, I am continually surprised at how frequently I run across people who don't know what their local library has to offer for them. Everyone knows we have books, and many know that we have DVDs; but way too many people don't know about the full range of programs and services that the library has to offer to them, and are surprised to hear about all that we do have once they find out.

As part of our ongoing effort to get the word out on everything libraries offer, New Castle County Libraries have started sending out an e-mail **Library Happenings Newsletter** that highlights upcoming programs, library news, and services available at the library that people may not know about. **Bear Library's Happenings Newsletter** is sent out twice a month, highlighting programs, events and services in the first and second half of every month. Our most recent newsletter covered a range of programs including the Summer Reading program, a Mindfulness workshop, and our weekly Knitting and Craft Club on Monday mornings. It also showcased the Book Buddy program available to home bound residents, and invited parents to enroll their children in the 1000 Books Before Kindergarten reading program to support future academic performance and reading skills.

Upcoming **Bear Happenings Newsletters** will continue to highlight programming and services available at the library, and will showcase new services as we roll them out. The one that has the public most excited is streaming video, which will be coming sometime this fall (Stay tuned for more information!) Introducing Zia Betts

As a mom who home schooled her 2 kids, Bear Library Assistant Zia Betts spent a lot of time in New Castle County libraries. Libraries were a research and study resource for her children, as well as a source of inspiration for the whole family. Several years later, heeding her daughter's sage advice, Zia became a library employee, initially working at Newark Library as an aide and Circulation Desk helper. She assumed similar duties at Elsmere Library (2013-2018) and had administrative responsibilities there (2018-2019). She transferred to Bear Library in May, where she works in the circulation department and also performs a variety of other support duties. Zia hopes to be assigned specific tasks in the near future, but for now she is "finding [her] way" by getting to know the staff and learning how the Bear Library operates. She occasionally is loaned out to other libraries as the need arises, but would like to claim a permanent position at Bear. Ideally, Zia envisions helping with programming, and perhaps tapping into her creativity by designing library displays, as she did at Elsmere. She is especially proud of a display she made of an African American woman. Besides coming up with an idea, Zia says that the fun part is thinking of ways to use materials she has on hand to use in the display. She has several ideas for displays that she wants to create for the Bear Library.

Born in Washington, DC, Zia grew up an only child. She attended a vocational high school, where she majored in sewing. Zia married young, then worked at various jobs, including bank clerk, bookkeeper, secretary, receptionist, and aide to a court reporter. She took time off from work to raise her 2 children: son Ramon, now 33, an employee at a Glasgow bottling plant; and daughter Rouné, 31, who works with the homeless. Zia is a proud grandmother to Ramon's 3 children: a boy, Jeriah, 11; and 2 girls, Makayla, 5, and Amiyah, 4. Ramon and family are expecting twins very soon, so Zia is looking forward to having more grandchildren to spoil!

Besides doting on her grandchildren, Zia is active in her church, where she hosts a prayer group and oversees the children's ministry. She also is taking theological classes to help her better identify with her Christian values. She doesn't sew much anymore, due to time constraints, but she has taken up crocheting and enjoys doing simple crafts with her grandchildren. Music preferences include R&B and gospel, which she finds to be very uplifting: "It speaks to me". She especially likes gospel artist Kim Walker-Smith and contemporary Christian music. Zia loves to attend the theatre, which her mother introduced her to as a girl. With young children to raise, Zia found ticket prices to be prohibitive, so she was not able to attend many performances. However, she recently took Makayla to see "Jesus" at Sight and Sound Theatre and was as enthralled by the child's wide-eyed wonderment as she was with the spectacle of the stage production! Zia likes sci-fi and police-themed movies and TV shows because viewers are encouraged to use their imaginations and problem-solving skills. "Ellery Queen Mysteries" was a special favorite because the TV show afforded the audience the opportunity to solve the mystery before the whodunit was revealed. Her interest in mysteries and thrillers extends to reading material. She reads E-books and listens to E-audiobooks. She recommends authors David Baldacci and Lisa Scottoline.

Zia vacationed in Florida last year, but she usually travels with a purpose other than recreation. As a teen, she went to Canada to work with the Civil Air Patrol. She has accompanied other church members on a pilgrimage to Romania, where she volunteered in orphanages and worked with a Gypsy community. Her desire is to travel to Israel to perform similar missionary work.

Zia admits that a penchant for acquiring purses and shoes may qualify as a collection; and she has accumulated "too many wine glasses, and mugs with sayings". But many of the sayings are inspirational and encouraging. With her new Bear Library position and growing family, Zia says that she is reinventing herself and enjoying the experiences and possibilities. She may even visit Israel some day!

This past summer, a Delaware institution celebrated a milestone birthday: the Delaware State Fair turned 100 years old. If you've never visited the state fair, it's loads of fun, with rides, games, food, and top-notch concerts. (This year's event included performances by country band Sugarland, Reba McEntire, and soul legend Gladys Knight).

Recently, we received a copy of a new book that celebrates the centennial of the state fair. *Treasured Tradition: Delaware State Fair Centennial – 100 Years of Family Fun* traces the state fair from its inception in 1919 as the Kent and Sussex County Fair to the modern incarnation that encompasses the best of the entire state. The book is loaded with historical photos and interviews with the people who put together the Delaware State Fair each year. It's a fascinating look at a piece of Delaware history and, what's more, the author of the book is literally our neighbor, living right down the street in Christiana.

You can find a copy of this interesting new book in Bear Library's Delaware collection. What's that? You didn't know that we have a Delaware collection? Why, we certainly do, and there's a lot to be learned there about the First State. Did you know that pirates sailed the coast of Delaware? Would you like to see beautiful coffee table books full of Andrew Wyeth's work? Or maybe you're interested in Delaware curiosities like scrapple. All you need to know about our little state is right there for you to explore. So, the next time you're visiting us, check out our Delaware collection.
