Regional and Municipal Elections

Campaigns for regional and municipal elections across Mauritania are in full swing. Twenty-five political parties will vie for the support of some 1.7 million voters across the country before elections take place on May 13th. In total, 145 regional lists and 1324 municipal lists will be up for grabs. The Key has compiled a list of parties competing in this cycle and the number of lists they will compete for.

1. Equity Party (Insaf): 13 regional councils, 238 municipal lists.
2. Tawassoul: 13 regional councils, 151 municipal lists.
3. Sawab : 12 regional councils, 129 municipal lists.

- The National Independent Electoral Commission has begun distributing voting cards for the upcoming elections, beginning with the city of Aïoun in Hodh El Gharbi. The commission received 12 million voting cards divided into 281 boxes for the 15 regions, at a cost of \$1,777,050 USD from a UAE-based company. This election is notable for the inclusion of a parliamentary list for youth and people with disabilities. In the previous election, the ruling Insaf party was on the verge of losing the majority, having received 51% of the votes. It stands to be seen whether the party can maintain its majority at the ballot box this time.

The Mauritanian Association to Support Cancer Patients, also known as AMAPC CHIVA, was founded in 2013 by Aichetou Echfagha. "I was watching a show on national TV about a campaign to help a cancer patient", said Echfagha as we walked through the Bird Park in Toujounin where the association held its annual fundraiser.

"Hamden Ould Tah spoke on the show and he asked all the youth to help the patients however they could," she continued as we passed a table where two members had placed the secondhand clothes that are to be sold, "the National Center of Oncology had just started three years ago at the time." After proposing the idea to the president of the Oncology Center, Echfagha started immediately the licensing process for her association. The process took three years, during which she and her volunteering members, who were only four at the time of the association's inception, continued helping the patients. The association now has seventy vo-

lunteering members. The fundraiser takes place every year at Bird Park in Toujounine. People donate used items to be sold over the period of three days. The items vary from clothes, appliances, jewelry, and even food and drinks. All of the money from the sales goes to cancer patients. "Malouma El Meidah has attended every event for 10 years." "We've had a rough time at the start," she explained, "at the time, people didn't even want to admit that cancer exists, and they didn't believe in a youth association." Nevertheless, the association continued and began to draw attention

to itself, and more people joined to volunteer and donate. "We offer both moral and financial support to the patients," she explained, "we also run awareness campaigns about the disease." "We organize parties for children during Eid al-Fitr, Eid al-Adha, and Eid-el-Maulud," said Zeineb Babah, deputy secretary general, "we also run a special school to teach children with cancer." The school started with six children, but Echfagha hopes it will grow to become the biggest school for children with cancer in the region. "Volunteers take shifts to attend to

patients at the center three days a week," Babah told me as we passed a group of people gathered around Malouma El Meidah, who was dancing to a recording of her hit song Yewden Yewden blasting through a speaker close by. The on-duty volunteers buy prescriptions, pay for medical tests and biopsies, and offer transportation fees from and to the hospital. The association also offers full care for some patients to even their food and clothes. The attitude towards cancer and the association has drastically changed over the past few years. "We've had women come to us after seeing an

interview on TV and learning that we pay completely for the mammogram as they wanted to do it," she explained, "people are willingly coming to do tests and mammograms, whereas before, they used to be afraid of just the mere mentioning of the disease." I asked Malouma how much they expect to raise this year, she told that the association is aiming at 2 million. I looked around at the products that are offered for sale, "what happens if you don't get that number?," I asked. "Then I and some of my friends will donate until we reach that number" she replied.

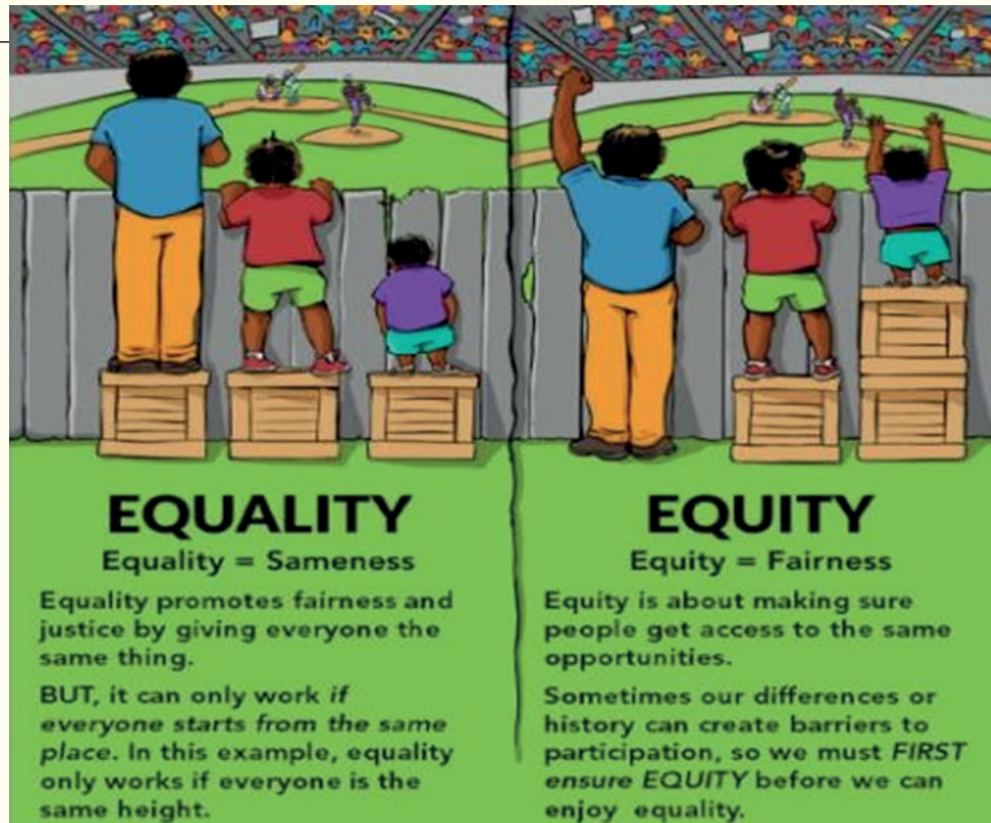
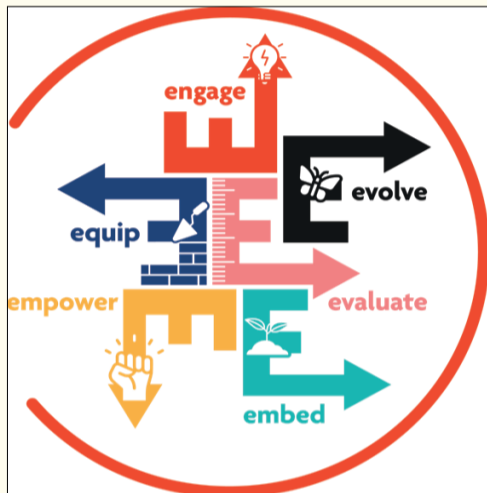

Clinical Depression and its Possible Treatments

Clinical depression is a silent killer among teenagers and adults. This fact prompted me to search for the root causes of this mental illness. As a result of my research i discovered a scientific piece of information that in the psychiatry field they haven't known the obvious root cause of depression, but they discovered that there are risk factors for this condition. The most important risk factors in causing clinical depression consist of the biological factors , the psychological factors, and the social factors. The biological factors can be represented in genes , hormones and neurotransmitters. The psychological factors essentially include rigid beliefs and inherited values . The social factors essentially are represented in poverty and crimes. But there are other secondary factors that can contribute to the diagnosis of depression. These factors can be described as the triggers of depression, such as life-changing events or addictive behaviors like addiction to junk food, consumption of sugary beverages, addiction to pornography and social media misuse . Many people perceive depression as a temporary feeling of



sadness and loneliness, and do not take it seriously. In reality, depression can range from mild feelings of sadness lasting weeks or months, to severe states with suicidal thoughts. It is estimated that about 4% of the world's population are diagnosed with clinical depression.

Depression is typically treated with the combination of behavioral cognitive therapy and medication, which is effective

for most patients. However, recent anecdotal evidence suggests that adopting a healthy diet, such as the ketogenic or carnivore diet, can be an impactful treatment for mental illnesses. It's important to note that the carnivore diet is an elimination diet that involves avoiding all plants, while the keto diet is a high-fat, low-carb diet.

The most prominent psychiatrist who advocates for using

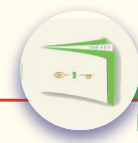
healthy diets in treating mental illnesses is the american psychiatrist Chris Palmer, Harvard's graduate. After 15 years of experience, Chris said he has successfully treated patients with depression and Bipolar using the keto diet. Chris said that some of his patients stopped taking medications after months of their adoption of the keto diet.

He believes that mitochondrial dysfunction can contribute to

mental disorders, and he wrote a book called «Brain Energy» about his experience in treating mental illnesses with diet. However, we should mention here the story of Jordan Peterson, a Canadian psychiatrist and writer, who said that he cured his depression with the carnivore diet after years of suffering with antidepressants. Peterson's daughter, Mikhaila, said she has cured her depression and put her autoimmune arthritis into remission after adopting the «lion diet.»

While it's important to note that these anecdotes do not negate the need for medication in treating mental illness, they do suggest that diet can have an impact on mental state. As such, people with depression or other concerning mental health conditions should consider correcting their behavior and adopting a healthy lifestyle. Finally we should mention here that Dr. Chris Palmer stated recently, that they are now conducting clinical trials to test the hypothesis that healthy diets can effectively treat mental illnesses and change the course of psychiatry and human medicine in general.

Inauguration of three Public Squares in the Mauritanian capital, Nouakchott



On the evening of, 17/04/23, the Mauritanian Prime Minister, Mohamed Bilal Masoud, inaugurated three public squares in the Mauritanian capital, Nouakchott, in preparation for their opening to citizens. The first square is «Haj Mahmoud Ba Square» in the district of Iksar, in the western region of Nouakchott. The second square is «Lahzam Al-Ma'youf Square» in the Riyadh district, in the southern region of Nouakchott. The third is «Bilal Al-Wali Square» in Tevragh-Zeina, in the western region of Nouakchott.

Minister of Housing «Said Ahmed Mohamed» confirmed that his sector has overseen the completion of these squares over the past few months, which are distributed among the three states of Nouakchott. The total cost of these squares was approximately 1.4 billion old Mauritanian Ouguiya. The Minister of Housing pointed out that the naming of these spaces is

inspired by a long history of unity and diversity, adding that the names of a constellation of our great ancestors who carried the sword, the pen, the torch of righteousness, and piety have been immortalized today.

These three squares constitute a quality addition to the urban face of the city of Nouakchott, which the sector has been working to improve for about four years. For her part, the president of the Nouakchott region, Fatima bint Abdel Malik, confirmed that the inauguration of the new public squares is a turning point in the history of urban development in the city of Nouakchott.» Ment bint Abdel Malik indicated that the region possesses the competencies and skills that enable it to manage, maintain, and develop these public facilities, and provide quality services that meet and keep up with the citizens' requirements in this field.

The board of directors of the National Company for Industry and Mining (Snim) expressed satisfaction with the results achieved by the institution during 2022, especially in terms of sales, which reached 13.35 million tons for the first time. During their meeting on Monday, the board highlighted the improvement recorded in production operations, where railway transport reached 12.8 million tons compared

to 12.6 million in 2021. The board praised what it called the company's commercial diversification policy, which enabled it to enter new markets in North Africa and Eastern Europe. The National Company for Industry and Mining (Snim) said it contributed 22% of the general budget's revenues, 9% of the gross domestic product, and 32% of the country's exports, to the national economy.

«Qatar Energy Enters the Field of Offshore Exploration in Mauritania»

Qatar Energy announced on Sunday its entry into the offshore exploration sector off the coast of Mauritania, after signing an agreement with Shell to acquire a stake of up to 40% in the exploration block (C10) located off the coast of Mauritania.

According to the agreement, Qatar Energy will own a 40% stake in the exploration and production agreement for the area, while Shell will own a 50% stake, and the «Mauritanian Petroleum Company» will own a 10% stake.

The C10 area covers approximately 11.5 thousand square kilometers, and is located about 50 kilometers off the coast of Mauritania in waters ranging in depth from 50 to 2,000 meters
