#### **OPENING**

### Introduction and Call to Order

- agreed that a quorum was present
- all those in attendance introduced themselves, including some first-time attendees
- call to order

Park Supervisor Report (Lisa Ragucci and )

- Upcoming bonfire on September 30<sup>th</sup>, 5-7pm
  - → There will be pelts, skulls, and bones on display as a part of the event
  - → This is a contained fire pit with trained staff and protective equipment
  - → Exact location TBD, those putting on the event have done many of these, and will pick a location based on what is safest that day (taking weather/wind into account)
  - →No s'mores provided as a part of the event, so it was recommended that WPAC provide marshmallows and encourage the public to bring their own additional s'mores-related items
- There was a motion to use WPAC funds to purchase 7-10 bags of marshmallows to add to the fun of the 9/30/2025 bonfire event
  - → the motion was seconded and passed with a majority vote
- 2 new porta potties are scheduled to arrive at the park this Friday (9/12), and will be in the park until the last weekend of October

- →Will be placed strategically, keeping in mind the ability for vehicles to enter/exit for delivery, pick-up, and cleaning, while also making sure there is easy access to a porta potty from both the playground and the baseball fields
- → ADA porta potties are required to face a path/paved walk
- →The two porta potties will be cleaned twice per week
- → Welles Park Parent Association (WPPA) is paying for them
- → The porta potty service going forward will be Service Sanitation
- → In future years, the porta potties will be in the park ranging from Mid-April to October (approximately), and Welles Park Baseball Association will provide funds towards the porta potties in addition to their regular fees. The funds will be given to the Parks/Lisa, so they will be in charge of ordering and placement of the porta potties going forward.
- It was asked if the stadium bathrooms could be an option
  - →context was provided that this has been a long-term discussion and is mostly a staffing issue
  - → Parks District jobs for bathroom attendants are typically for parks with their own fieldhouse
- There is a 3<sup>rd</sup> porta potty that is provided by CPS, so they should be consulted about any issues with that particular unit

### **Public Comment**

 Concern was expressed about how many hours each weekend that the WPPA uses the park, especially during the summer

## **OLD BUSINESS**

#### Natural Areas Mow

- On the 23<sup>rd</sup> there was a large mow of the natural areas
- A boiler plate email was sent 2 days before mentioning a mow
- In the past these mows have usually been selective, this time the mow was major and planned for all 3 natural areas
- This was a shock, and hugely upsetting for so many
  - →After much public concern with the mowing of the first natural area, it was agreed to stop mowing for the day
- Everyone agreed the Park District had a communication issue
  - →On the 29<sup>th</sup> Andre spoke with the Parks Superintendent
- It has been agreed going forward that the Park District will give a quarterly report of what is happening and why, this was previously only shared once a year

- Matt says that this will not happen again without thorough warning
- There has been a report created through a lot of work by Tessa, that tracks what is in the natural areas, what is thriving and what is not.

### Winnemac Surveys

- Deb shared an overview and update about the survey
- There are signs throughout the park encouraging visitors to fill out the survey
- So far there have been 186 responses
- Some meeting attendees came to the meeting due to the survey
- Some highlights so far include:
  - → Natural Areas are overwhelmingly the main attraction to many
  - → Bathrooms are a concern
  - →There have been some who have suggested additional cameras to be placed in the park
  - →Suggestions for features like water fountains, more pickleball courts, and other equipment
  - → Suggestions for activities like more movies in the park, collaborations with the student garden, music events, and more events that are not specifically directed towards families
- Many people who filled out the survey expressed a willingness to volunteer at events, and to help with advocacy of the park

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

### WFFA

- There was a motion to reauthorize the Winnemac Fourth For All event in 2026
  →the motion was seconded and passed with a majority vote
- Please volunteer!!

#### Birding

- It was discussed to possibly promote birding opportunities to younger audiences
  Possibly coordinated directly with Chappell?
- September 20<sup>th</sup> there will be back-to-back walks that are almost at capacity in terms of participants who have signed up, though sign up is still open
  - →There is not a lot of programming funding, but we are trying to grow more opportunities and programming

### Natural Areas

- There was a Natural Areas workday on the 30<sup>th</sup>, worked on invasive species
- Next work day is Saturday, September 27<sup>th</sup>
