## Eagle's Dell Farm, LLC Sales Policy Mini-Nubian and Nigerian Dwarf Goats

We, at Eagle's Dell Farm, LLC, know and love each one of our goats, their individual traits and personalities, so if we ask you a lot of questions we are simply trying to ensure that you and our goat will be a good match. We are a small farm and focus on breeding high quality dairy goats from proven milking lines with good dairy character, breed conformation, and temperament.

All does & in-tact bucks will be sold with American Dairy Goat Association (ADGA) or Miniature Dairy Goat Association (MDGA) registration paperwork as is appropriate to their breed, unless noted otherwise. Some may also be registered with The Miniature Goat Registry (TMGR). Pricing below are for kids, adult pricing will generally be higher.

In-tact buck prices start at \$250 w/ registration paperwork. Buck kids born that are to our standards of breeding quality will be available as in-tact bucks until approximately 12 weeks of age. If no reservations are pending by that time, they may then be offered as wethers (castrated bucks) for pets/companion animals. A deposit will reserve your already born buckling until weaning at 10-12 weeks of age. We require a \$100 deposit for each buck you wish to purchase. Deposits are non-refundable. An additional \$10/ week will be charged for each week after weaning that the goat isn't picked up & brought to it's new home, unless prior arrangements are made.

Wether (castrated bucks) prices: \$150 each--Discounts on multiple wether purchases.

Doe prices start at \$350 with registration paperwork. A deposit will reserve your already born doeling or milk goat until weaning time when kids are 10+ weeks of age. We require \$100 deposit per doe purchased, deposits are non-refundable. An additional \$10/week will be charged for each week after weaning or prearranged pick-up date if the goat isn't picked up & brought to it's new home, unless prior arrangements are made.

All Does that are sold as "exposed" or "bred" prior to leaving our farm will receive a "doe only" service memo. This means that you will not register any buck kids under our farm name. As you probably already understand, no guarantee of kidding outcome (number of kids, gender, etc) can be made.

All kids on our farm that are not polled will be disbudded within the first 2 weeks of life (horn buds burned off). Even though the goats are disbudded, occasionally-especially with the bucks--they can develop scurs & sometimes a horn can even still grow. We can not guarantee 100% that there won't be growth but we will do our best to prevent it. We also test our herd on a regular basis for CL, CAE, Johnes, & de-worm when needed. Our does in milk and participating in the Small Herd Exemption Raw Milk Permit are also tested and registered with the Idaho State Department of Agriculture (ISDA) annually for TB and Brucellosis. Buyer will be responsible for any travel expenses including paperwork needed (health certificate, etc..).

Once a goat is sold and it leaves our farm, it's yours. If you are an inexperienced goat owner (we all started there once, right?) we encourage you to be knowledgeable and careful in the selection of your goat, and in the care required. We will answer any questions you may have about a goat from our herd you're considering, and will also ask you many questions, so please don't be offended. We do this to ensure our goats are going to a suitable home. We have invested our time, our hearts, and finances in our herd, and it's important to us that they will be well cared for after they leave our farm.

All new goats are quarantined upon arrival to make sure they are healthy before being introduced to our herd.

We make it a point to purchase our goats from farms that have tested negative for CAE, CL and Johne's. On the rare occasion a newly purchased adult goat has not been tested for the above diseases, that will be done before they are released from quarantine.
