John Spiropoulos In Studio	The FISA Spying on Team Trump began in late October 2016. But the FBI knew it had a problem. Its whole case rested on the Steele Dossier which had never been corroborated. John Spiropoulos In Studio	During 3 days of questioning in January 2017 the Primary Sub-Source demolished the credibility of both Steele and his dossier. But the FBI kept that fact a secret. And it stayed s secret for nearly 3 years.
Video/Graphics	The true story was hidden in the pages of this FBI summary of the interview, written

44 by the Intel analyst. The facts only came to
45 light after the memo was analyzed by
46 investigators for the Inspector General at the
47 Justice Department.

49 John Spiropoulos In Studio The FBI's interview team covered up the
50 Primary Sub-Source's story, a story that
51 should have immediately stopped all the
52 spying but didn't. The identity of the
53 Primary Sub-source was a secret until mid
54 2020.

57 Fox Sunday Morning Futures morning as the Sub-Source of the
58 dossier, Igor Danchenko, has
59 been unmasked. Tell me about this
60 Sub-Source.

63 and the media led Congress to
64 believe and they led the American
65 public to believe that somehow
66 Steele had this really super-secret
67 Source that nobody could know
68 about. Well, it ends up that he used to
69 work for the Brookings Institute. It
70 looks like there are a lot of
71 connections to the Brookings which
72 to those of your viewers who don't
73 know what this is. This is like the
74 prominent, left-wing think tank here
75 in our nation's capital.

77 Sen. Lindsey Graham (R-SC) LG I always assumed the Russian
78 Sub-Source was some guy in
79 Russia deep in the bowels of
80 the Kremlin feeding this stuff
81 to Christopher Steele. The
82 Sub-Source was a senior Russian
83 researcher at the Brookings
84 Institute and an employee of
85 Christopher Steele living in the

United States.

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88	Video/Graphics	Danchenko was born and raised in Russia.
89		He went to college there, came to the U.S.
90		for graduate school. He lives and works in
91		Washington, DC.
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93	Video/Graphics	He was interviewed at the FBI's Washington
94		Field Office.

96	John Spiropoulos In Studio	Danchenko shredded the dossier's
97		credibility. But that assessment can't be
98		found anywhere in this 57-page summary of
99		the interview. Not even a hint.

101	Video/Graphics	Instead the Intel Analyst composed a
102		difficult to follow memo. Parts of it are
103		perfectly opaque.

105	John Spiropoulos In Studio	This memo is written in such a way so as to
106		discourage anyone from reading very much
107		of it. Make no mistake about it. The FBI
108		buried Danchenko's story in January 2017.
109		And it stayed buried until the IG's
110		investigators exposed it in December 2019.

112	Video/Graphics	Page 187 of the IG report states:

114	Video/Graphics	The Primary Sub-Source says there is "zero
115		corroboration" of the information in the
116		dossier.

118	Sen. Ted Cruz (R-TX)	TC What did the Sub-Source say,
119		specifically, are your report goes on
120		to say, it says Steele misstated or
121		exaggerated multiple sections of the
122		reporting.

124	Sen. Lindsey Graham (R-TX)	LG What does the Russian guy tell the
125		FBI about the dossier? That Steele
126		misstated or exaggerated the
127		Prime Sub-Source's statements.
