FMCA Roadside Rescue is powered by a separate entity (SafeRide RV Club) which costs additional, just like AAA or any other insurance/roadside assistance, and is NOT automatically included in your membership.

The Lost Dutchman State Park is nearby and perfect for hiking, flora and wildlife viewing, and the

Goldfield Ghost Town is also close by. A not-to-be-missed is the Lost Dutchman-

Superstition Museum with its exhibits, history, & village. Driving the scenic & dramatic Apache Trail will of course be on our agenda, with stops at Canyon Lake, Tortilla Flat, Apache Lake, & more. The "famous" Fountain Hills Festival of the Arts is Feb. 22-24, and an easy scenic drive away. A favorite of ours is Queen Creek Olive Mill where you can tour the processing plant and sample a plethora of assorted oils, tapenas, sauces, vinegars, olives, natural beauty products, while enjoying a creative list of lunch options. And, of course all of Phoenix and what it has to offer is within an hour's drive or less.

Right next to the park is "Barleen's Dinner and Show" theater. If you want to go one evening you need to make a reservation NOW. The cost is \$40 per person. Call 480-982-7991. It's ok to miss a happy hour to go.

In addition to the campground, the park offers a beach, picnic area with ramadas, tables and grills, a creek trail, boat ramps, and a marina. The nearby



Lakeside Market offers boat rentals and supplies. The campground overlooks
