The North Salt Lake City rally will be going in all directions! The RV Park is located just 6-7 miles from downtown SLC where we will explore Temple Square and other historical sites. We will go east to Park City to explore this historical resort town and the Utah Olympic Park, then west to explore the Great Salt Lake and Antelope Island, then north to Ogden where we will learn about the history of Union Station and the meeting of the rails. Union Station houses the Browning Firearms Museum. Scenic mountain drives to Park City and returning from Ogden will give you an appreciation of the beauty of the Wasatch Mountains.

They also have noted on their website "no cancellation fees for 2020", so sign up now, even if you are not sure. NOTE: The state of Utah is in the process of returning to the "new normal". Hopefully, all planned activities will be available by the time of our rally. The exact order of the days/events will be determined when the Rally draws closer.

Day 1, Monday, Jun 7: Arrive/check-in

Day 2, Tuesday, Jun 8: Exploring Park City We will visit the Utah Olympic Park in the morning. No charge to visit two museums, watch athletes train or explore the venue. We will then go into Park City where we will eat lunch and explore on our own. The Park City Museum is very interesting and covers the mining industry and skiing history of Park City. You may want to take a scenic gondola ride or chairlift ride. There is a hop on, hop off trolley that runs through Park City and, of course, there is plenty of shopping. It is also a great leisurely stroll, if the weather cooperates.

Day 3, Wednesday, Jun 9: The Great Salt Lake and Antelope Island State Park We will drive across the Great Salt Lake on the 7-mile causeway. First, we will spend time in the Visitor Center. Then we will drive south on the island to the historic Fielding Garr Ranch, hoping to see the herds of buffalo and other wildlife along the way. We can tour the ranch house and out buildings. We will take a sack lunch

.Day 4, Thursday, Jun 10: Downtown Salt Lake City We will visit Temple Square, the No. 1 tourist attraction in Utah. We will enjoy the beautiful gardens. Three buildings on the square were built by the pioneers: the six-spired granite Salt Lake Temple; the acoustically perfect domed Tabernacle, original home of the Tabernacle Choir and the famed organ; and the Assembly Hall with its white spires and stained-glass windows. There are museums and a Visitor's Center on the square. At 12:00 we will make our way to the Tabernacle to hear a free organ concert. We will eat lunch near the square (restaurant to be determined). In the afternoon, we will visit the Family Search Center where you can explore your own family history and records.

Day 5, Friday, Jun 11: Union Station and Notorious 25th Street in OgdenWe will visit the historic Union Station and learn about its history as we follow along with a 30-minute podcast. We can spend additional time in Union Station viewing the

Railroad Museum, the John M Browning Firearms Museum, or the Classic Car Museum, depending on your interests. We will eat lunch on historic 25th Street and after lunch we will walk 2 blocks up and back 25th Street as we listen to another podcast and learn the history of why it is called "Notorious 25th Street". We will return to our RV Park by driving east through Ogden Canyon (a scenic byway), over Trapper's Loop and Snow Basin Ski area (amazing views and vistas) and west through Weber Canyon back to our RV Park. Day 6 , Saturday, Jun 12, Free day On your own to explore what interests you. So many possibilities and we will have a list for you. Perhaps, some may want to take the drive to the Golden Spike National Historical Park, or visit This is the Place Heritage Park, or visit Trolley Square or more museums in SLC. Day 7, Sunday, Jun 13, Departure Day If you paid for 6 nights, you got a 7th

night free and will then have the option to spend this day in the area as well, leaving on the morning of June 13th.

Stay in/around "Leadville" visiting, at 9:00AM "if" want to go as a group?? (1.) The National "Hall-of-Fame" Mining Museum (\$10 each)...it IS a wow experience. Other must-see/do experiences: "Tabor Opera House" — Hotel Delaware — Silver Dollar Saloon — Pioneer Saloon (lot-a-drinkinggoing-ON??)

Leadville, Colorado & Southern Railroad....\$42/ person. Scenic route north east of Leadville. Train goes up close to Climax "molybdenum" Mine" (one year it mined \$4 Billion worth of Moly)—it WAS a big operation



(Sunday) July 25th: Free Day ... do as you please. <u>Possibilities</u>:



Gilman (above) is closed to foot traffic as it is built above dangerous cliffs. Red Cliff is before Gilman and is a fun town to explore/visit....neat "bridge" on highway 24, at Red Cliff.

Fishing at (1.) go see the "Camp Hale World War II" training site for the famous "Tenth Mountain Division" used to be able to dry-camp anyplace on Camp Hale property, vandals killed it! From Camp Hale take #24 to Gold Park and Home stake Reservoir for a fun drive (road 'iffy' in 2019)...or take #24 to "Gilman Town-site"... A Ghost Town! Only Ghost town in Colorado that "WAS" up for sale [whole town for sale, once, for about \$250,000] in the early 2000's....Google it). "Gilman" Colorado, located towards Minturn and Vail (2.) Rent a bike and ride the 12-mile "Mineral Belt Trail" that circles Leadville, tis the old 'train-route' that collected all the ore from the major mines. (3.) Turquoise Lake Road, 12 mile circle around Turquoise Lake, scenic and good fishing.... (4.) Mount Elbert (highest mountain in Colorado at 14,439) where you can walk the short route to the top OR go fishing in Twin Lakes near the hydro-plant, for best fishing. OR drive the "Halfmoon Gulch Road" up behind Mt Elbert, for another scenic trip. (5.) See "The National Fish Hatchery" (NO fishing) west of Leadville "Soda Springs" near the hatchery (as child my parents would take us boys, "3-of us") to the soda-springs with a big bottle of grape-juice, walla instant grapesoda-pop...go do likewise, you'll love it! (6.) The TWO "Cemeteries" west of town....old and new grave stones to inspect....my Uncle Car Feltner, age 18 months, died of the 1918 Flu-then) or as we enjoy "Happy Hour" OUR last night of the Rally ... Stories told to Don, by his father, George, who was born (1908-2002) in Leadvill and lived there until 1920! Then hearabout (A.) At 10,152 feet above sea level, Leadville is the highest incorporated city in North America. Colorado's two tallest fourteeners — mountains higher than 14,000 feet — tower above the area, including 14,433-foot Mt. Elbert and 14,421-foot Mt. Massive. Twin Lakes, located adjacent to the state's two largest glacial lakes in the shadow of Mt. Elbert, provides gorgeous views of the neighboring summits and is a popular spot for photographers. A drive on the 'Top of the Rockies' Scenic and Historic Byway is an excellent way to capture Lake County's best views. The 82-mile route traverses the 12,095-foot Independence Pass, affording sights of sky-scraping peaks, sprawling valleys and reflective lakes.

Ghost Ranch is also known for a remarkable concentration of fossils, most notably that of the theropod dinosaur Coelophysis, of which it has been estimated that nearly a thousand individuals have been preserved in a quarry at Ghost Ranch.
