Reservation Details: Call Pony Express Resort (877-421-7002) to make your reservation and advise them that you are with Cuatro Estados for a group rate parking with our group. Please also give one of the rallymasters, above, a call and let us know you are coming. They also have noted on their website "no cancellation fees for 2020", so sign up now, even if you are not sure.

NOTE: The state of Utah is in the process of returning to the "new normal". Hopefully, all planned activities will be available by the time of our rally. The exact order of the days/events will be determined when the Rally draws closer.

Day 1, Monday, Sep 21: Arrive/check-in

Day 2, Tuesday, Sep 22: Exploring Park City We will visit the Utah Olympic Park in the morning. No charge to visit two museums, watch athletes train or explore the venue. We will then go into Park City where we will eat lunch and

explore on our own. The Park City Museum is very interesting and covers the mining industry and skiing history of Park City. You may want to take a scenic gondola ride or chairlift ride. There is a hop on, hop off trolley that runs through Park City and, of course, there is plenty of shopping. It is also a great leisurely stroll, if the weather cooperates.

Day 3, Wednesday, Sep 23: The Great Salt Lake and Antelope Island State Park We will drive across the Great Salt Lake on the 7-mile causeway. First, we will spend time in the Visitor Center. Then we will drive south on the island to the historic Fielding Garr Ranch, hoping to see the herds of buffalo and other wildlife along the way. We can tour the ranch house and out buildings. We will take a sack lunch.

Day 4, Thursday, Sep 24: Downtown Salt Lake City We will visit Temple Square, the No. 1 tourist attraction in Utah. We will enjoy the beautiful gardens. Three buildings on the square were built by the pioneers: the six-spired granite Salt Lake Temple; the acoustically perfect domed Tabernacle, original home of the Tabernacle Choir and the famed organ; and the Assembly Hall with its white spires and stained-glass windows. There are museums and a Visitor's Center on the square. At 12:00 we will make our way to the Tabernacle to hear a free organ concert. We will eat lunch near the square (restaurant to be determined). In the afternoon, we will visit the Family Search Center where you can explore your own family history and records.

Day 5, Friday, Sep 25: Union Station and Notorious 25th Street in OgdenWe will visit the historic Union Station and learn about its history as we follow along with a 30-minute podcast. We can spend additional time in Union Station viewing the Railroad Museum, the John M Browning Firearms Museum, or the Classic Car Museum, depending on your interests. We will eat lunch on historic 25th Street and after lunch we will walk 2 blocks up and back 25th Street as we listen to another podcast and learn the history of why it is called "Notorious 25th Street". We will return to our RV Park by driving east through Ogden Canyon (a scenic byway), over Trapper's Loop and Snow Basin Ski area (amazing views and vistas) and west through Weber Canyon back to our RV Park.

Day 6, Saturday, Sep 26 Free day On your own to explore what interests you. So many possibilities and we will have a list for you. Perhaps, some may want to take the drive to the Golden Spike National Historical Park, or visit This is the Place Heritage Park, or visit Trolley Square or more museums in SLC.

Day 7, Sunday, Sep 27: Departure Day If you paid for 6 nights, you got a 7th night free and will then have the option to spend this day in the area as well, leaving on the morning of Sep 28

Please call and reserve your site under Joe/Anne Thomas. The group rate if we get **10 rigs** is \$36 plus tax = \$40.67 per night, \$244.03 (6 nights). You will be charged a \$44 deposit. Any additional days will be at the peak rate of \$44 plus tax = \$49.71 **OR** if we don't get 10 rigs this will be the daily rate as well. The resort does offer a discount for AAA, Good Sam, AARP, FMCA and veterans with ID. Cancellations 48 hours prior to arrival date \$20 administrative fee charged, less than 48 hours \$44 deposit will be forfeited. If the resort must cancel our event for COVID-19 regulations, there should not be a cancellation fee.

Please email us also once you make your reservation.

We will not have use of the social gathering room, but the pool and laundry should be open; fitness center and library presently closed. We should be able to gather outside. At this point **MASKS** are required inside the resort and most of the surrounding areas we plan to visit.

Due to COVID-19 and the unpredictability of what places may be open or allow a limited number of people in at one time we are not making a day by day schedule. Instead, will leave it open for members to choose if they car-pool or where they would like to explore each day. List of places to visit

Montezuma Castle (Montezuma's Well currently closed) and Tuzigoot National Monuments: short hike a both places, bring National Park pass in case fees aren't waived, 25 mile scenic drive between sites on County Road 30 thru Cornville, which is good place to stop for lunch at Grasshopper Grill. Other options are to go to lunch in Camp Verde at JT's bistro or Crusty's Pizza and take AZ -260 to Tuzigoot thru Cottonwood or make a complete circle coming back thru Cottonwood.

Old town Cottonwood: offers a variety of shops, antiques, restaurants and enjoy some of Verde Valley wine trail wineries.

Jerome: visit State Historic Park tour Douglas Mansion, take a Ghost Town tour, visit Gold King Mine, eat at the famous Haunted Hamburger, plenty of shops, wineries to visit, bring your walking shoes the town is built on a side of a hill.

Sedona: take a Pink Jeep tour, stroll around the town's many shops and restaurants, drive Red Rock Scenic Byway, visit Chapel of Holy Cross, hike in the red walled canyons.

Clarkdale: enjoy Fall colors by taking train ride on Verde Canyon Railroad (may

want to make reservation before arrival at www.verdecanyonrr.com) visit Copper Art Museum (currently closed due to covid-19).

Camp Verde/Fort Verde: State Historic Park, old downtown, Cliff Castle Casino (across from Distant Drums), Out of Africa Wildlife Park

Prescott: day trip (45 miles)/visit downtown shops, antique stores, historic Courthouse Square, museums, hiking, biking, and kayaking

This popular KOA fills up quickly for the summer months, so you need to make reservations NOW! The well-known Glenwood Springs Pool is the big draw to this area, but it's not the only attraction. The drive east of town through

Glenwood Canyon is an engineering marvel, with a hike/bike trail that goes the whole distance practically on top of the raging Colorado River. The Redstone's interesting history and coal company town, along with its Castle, is 20 miles south, and continuing south is Marble CO, where the marble for the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier & Lincoln Memorial came from. You can also reach famous Aspen ski village an hour out of Glenwood Springs, and adventure further to hike to the Maroon Bells (one of the most picturesque views in the Rockies). Perhaps one of the most iconic hikes in this region is to Hanging Lake, a steep and challenging route. Reservations are required WAY in advance, and a shuttle takes you there from Glenwood Springs.

From the Great Salt Lake to the west to the ski slopes of the Wasatch Mountains to the east, adventures abound in all directions. The RV Park is located just 6 or 7 miles from the State Capitol and Temple Square, and adjacent to the Jordan River & a state OHV rec area. Several National Historic Trails route through SLC. Some of the best preserved historical areas are in and around SLC. Several scenic mountain roads offer access to endless hiking and picnicking along rushing creeks and waterfalls. Visit Fort Verde Historic Park, then drive parts of General Crook's Trail through the Mingus Mtns. Nearby are the ancient ruins of Montezuma Castle & Tuzigoot National Monuments, and the fascinating Montezuma's Well. Not too far away are the red rocks of Sedona, picturesque Oak Creek Canyon, historic mining town of Jerome (don't miss the mining museum), backroads drives into surrounding mountains, Verde Canyon Railroad scenic train ride, and so much more. There's even a casino across the highway from the resort!
